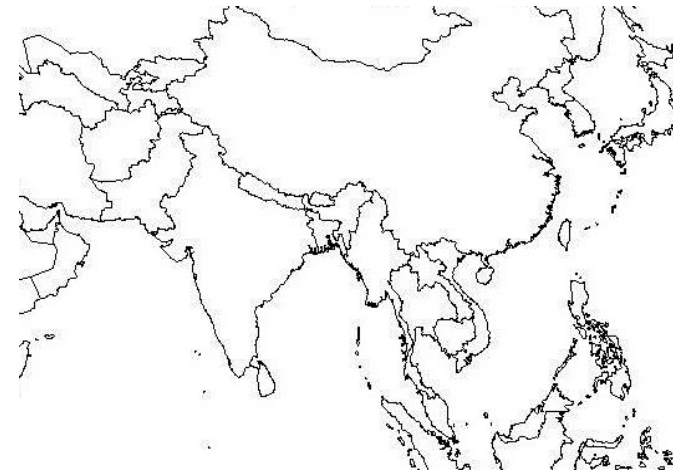

Graduate Certificate in Asian Studies

Total 15 Credit Hours

At least 3 of the 5 required courses must be at the 600 level

The 5 courses must be drawn from at least 3 of the following disciplines:
Anthropology, Art History, Classical and Modern languages, Geography, History, Humanities, Political Science, Sociology, Theatre Arts, or Women's and Gender Studies.

3 credit hours in Humanities (exclusive of language courses)

3 credit hours in Social Sciences.

Demonstrate reading knowledge Chinese, Japanese, or another Asian language.

An internship in an Asia related community or business may be substituted for 3 credit hours.
