Good Day Black Faculty/Staff Association Members, Allies and Affiliates,

Can you believe it's been two-years since a group of veteran, senior and selected faculty and staff were convened to reconvene BFSA? With the restructuring and revision of the Constitution and Bylaws, a new cadre of volunteer Executive Officers began the work of facilitating our mission.

Working together, we established BFSA as a leader, supporter and collaborator with and among our peer employee resource groups and our CODRE and COSW affiliates through our proactive teamwork, hyperactive social media, and interactive professional and social networking events aimed at building community and championing causes for 200+ members.

As BFSA president, it was important to me to build a robust infrastructure and establish social networks to build trust among our Black faculty, staff and allies. Many of us didn't even know each other prior to our coming together, which is why we created and held an annual **Welcome B(l)ack Meet and Greet** social networking event, annual **(Blended) Holiday Party** with our peer affinity groups, and our **annual meeting and reception** in support of area Black businesses. To support our students, we created our own funding stream and participated in UofL's annual **"RaiseSomeL" Campaign** to fund student scholarships and held periodic events in collaboration with the **Cultural Center** and **S.C.O.R.E** during Black History Month. For Black faculty and staff, we created a few **professional development seminars**, **"BFSA After Dark" socials**, and an annual Staff Recognition via **The Dr. Mordean Taylor-Archer (MTA) Service Award**. Remarkably, a lot of this was done via personal (monetary) donations, fundraising, and a budget from the office of Dr. Mordean Taylor Archer, now under the leadership of Dr. Faye Jones, the Interim Senior Associate Vice President for Diversity and Equity (SAVPDE).

Unfortunately, due to the Coronavirus pandemic and subsequent remote operations for physical/social distancing, we were not able to **formerly recognize** our **two inaugural "Bridging the Gap" student scholarship winners** nor the **MTA Service award winner** at our annual meeting and reception as planned. In addition, in the absence of a web master, we haven't been able to showcase them on our website, either. **We will hold a celebration in their honor when able**.
