What are Brownfields?


Real property, the expansion, redevelopment, or reuse of which may be complicated by the presence or potential presence of a hazardous substance, pollutant, or contaminant (EPA.GOV).

What is a Brownfields Area-Wide Plan?

Not single site-based; focus is on area-wide improvement and investment strategies.


Why was this corridor/area selected by Louisville Metro?



EXPECTED OUTCOMES OF A BROWNFIELDS AREA-WIDE PLAN FOR GERMANTOWN/SHELBY PARK RAIL CORRIDOR

- Identification of:
- Catalyst sites in addition to the five;
- Desirable types of redevelopment;
- Implementation strategies for redevelopment; and
- The development of plans for connectivity between the surrounding neighborhoods.









CATALYST SITE A

Louisville Cotton Mill

- 946 Goss Avenue
- 7.68 Acres
- All 7 buildings on site make up ~268K SF







CATALYST SITES B&D

- B FORMER EXMET SITE
- **D** WASTE TRANSFER STATION
 - SITE B, ~3.2 Acres
 - Vacant, former Rail Spur
 - SITE D, ~ 7.2 Acres
 - Waste Transfer & Recycling Center







CATALYST SITE C BRADFORD MILLS

- ~2 Acres
- 85k SF Structure









CATALYST SITE E HOPE MILLS & BLUEBIRD PIE FACTORY

- ~1.5 Acres
- ~ 75k SF Structure


