As Dr. Faye Jones ends her three-year term serving as the interim senior associate vice president for diversity and equity, we take this opportunity to thank her for the outstanding leadership, commitment, dedication, and service she provided leading the university's diversity, equity, and inclusion initiatives. Under her leadership, UofL was designated a Diversity Champion by *Insight Into Diversity* magazine

for 2020 and 2021, a designation awarded to a limited number of colleges and universities that "exemplify an unyielding commitment to diversity and inclusion throughout their campus communities, across academic programs, and at the highest administrative levels." She is also responsible for UofL becoming an institutional member of the National Center for Faculty Development and Diversity, a leading provider of professional development programs that support faculty, staff, and students to make a successful transition into careers in higher education. Additionally, she enabled faculty and staff to participate in professional development experiences, including the Women of Color in the Academy conference, the National Conference on Race and Ethnicity in Higher Education, and USC's four-week Equity Now! program, among others. She initiated and coordinated participation for every HSC dean (or designee) to participate in the Aspen Institute Executive Leadership Seminar for Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion.

Faye served on several committees, including chair of CODRE's Campus Environment Team, and provided key leadership to various university-wide initiatives, including coordinating recommendations and actions for President Bendapudi's Cardinal Anti-Racism Initiative. She was the institutional representative to the Council on Postsecondary Education's Committee on Equal Opportunities and provided oversight of the university's diversity planning process.

Under her leadership the Office of Diversity and Equity provided financial support to the Black Faculty/Staff Association, the Hispanic/Latino Faculty and Staff Association, and the Asian American/Pacific Islander Faculty and Staff Association, and Faye served as the Executive Champion for the LGBTQ+ Faculty and Staff Association. One of her proudest accomplishments is providing leadership in the creation and opening of the new Cultural and Equity Center.

As she returns to her primary roles as Associate Vice President for Health Affairs / Diversity Initiatives and Professor, Department of Pediatrics, we acknowledge and celebrate the many contributions she continues to make to help make UofL a great place to learn, work, and invest.

UNDERGRADUATE RESEARCH OPPORTUNITIES

The University of Louisville Bridge to the Baccalaureate (ULBB), funded by the NIH to improve success of students transferring into STEM+H majors at UofL. ULBB is starting their second summer after delaying our start in 2020 due to the pandemic. The program pays students full time in two summers, so this year we will have students returning from last summer as well as a new cohort starting. In the first summer, students spend 6 weeks taking classes about biomedical research and career strategies as well as completing regulatory training and learning some laboratory techniques before spending 4 weeks in a research lab. In Year 2, students spend most of their 10-week program working full time in a research lab. The program culminates each year with a poster presentation session where everyone can show off their work. For questions, please email Dr. Cynthia Corbitt, investigator for this grant.



Additionally, **Dr. Corbitt** also received a grant that focuses on research in **Cancer & Health Disparities summer bridge research progra**m. It is funded by the KY Council on Postsecondary Education to improve retention of underrepresented minority students and those who are economically disadvantaged. Entering freshmen spend 8 weeks learning about college life and doing research. **Dr. LaCreis Kidd** and I are co-Pls. **Apply by April 15.**


