
estimated amount of grant disbursements related to community engagement for the 2017-18* academic vear

University faculty and administrators received a total of 102 grants totaling \$17,219,551 during the 2017-18 academic year. The grants addressed a variety of issues in the community including training and education, research, project assessment and direct services. Some of the top units to receive funding include the Kent School of Social Work, College of Education and Human Development (CEHD), the School of Medicine, the College of Arts & Sciences, and the School of Public Health and Information Sciences. Of the total amount awarded, \$2,982,034 either directly or indirectly benefited the Signature Partnership Initiative area of west Louisville.
