- DEMOGRAPHICS CHANGED TO VAST MAJORITY OF PATIENTS SPEAKING SPANISH AS PRIMARY LANGUAGE

- NEED FOR MORE SERVICES
 - WOMEN'S HEALTH
 - MENTAL HEALTH
- MORE FACULTY WISHING TO PRACTICE
- DESIRE TO HAVE MORE CONTROL OVER SCHEDULE
 - APPOINTMENTS
 - ELECTRONIC HEALTH RECORDS

CURRENT STATISTICS

- 450 PATIENTS WITH AVERAGE OF 3
 VISITS EACH FOR 1350 VISITS A YEAR
- 44% FEMALE AND 56% MALE
- 80% LATINO; 17% CAUCASIAN; 3% AA
- AVERAGE AGE 40
- AVERAGE BMI 27

- 9% OF PATIENTS HAVE DIAGNOSIS OF DM2
- 49.5% HAVE A HBA1C 5.7 OR GREATER
- 18% OF PATIENTS HAVE HTN
- 31 % HAVE A GI COMPLAINT
- 44% HAVE A MUSCULOSKELETAL COMPLAINT
- 21% HAVE A RESPIRATORY COMPLAINT


