Sanction Check Potential Match Verification Procedures for Employees or Affiliated Individuals

- 1. Name Review Compare the university employee or affiliated individual's name (including first, middle, and last name) to the name of the individual identified as a potential match per the SanctionCheck.com (SC) search results (e.g., "James E. Brown" listed as potential match to "John L. Brown" on the SC report for an individual). If a reasonable likelihood of a match exists, then proceed to step 2 (See Employees or Affiliated Individuals Potential Match Review Template).
- 2. Date of Birth (DOB) Compare the university employee or affiliated individual's DOB to the potential match's DOB. You may need to view the potential match's debarment/exclusion record on file with the respective agency's online search system to determine if a DOB is available. If the DOB for the potential match is not available or if a reasonable likelihood of a match exists, then proceed to step 3.
- **3. Social Security Number (SSN)** Compare the university employee or affiliated individual's SSN to the SSN for the potential match. You will need to verify the SSN against the respective agency's online search system. If SSN is not available or if a reasonable likelihood of a match exists, then proceed to step 4.

4. Address Analysis:

- a. Address/Hire Date Analysis Compare the university employee or affiliated individual's address (city and state) on file (HR's Workday) to the potential match's address (city and state) available via the respective agency's online debarment/exclusion record. If the university employee or affiliated individual was hired after the action date for the potential match, if the address is not available or if a reasonable likelihood of a match exists, proceed to step 4.b.
- b. Address/Action Date Analysis Compare the university employee or affiliated individual's address (city and state) history on file (HR's Workday) to determine the individual's address at the time of the potential match's debarment/exclusion action date and compare it to the potential match's address per the debarment/exclusion record. If a reasonable likelihood of a match continues to exist, then proceed to step 5.
- 5. Certification Form If the university department or administrative office is unable to clear the university employee or affiliated individual using the verification procedures 1 through 4 above, a "Sanction Check" certification form must be signed by the university employee or affiliated individual. The signature is attestation that the individual has never been excluded, suspended, debarred, or otherwise deemed ineligible to participate in Federal and/or State programs. The signed certification form should be provided to the University Integrity and Compliance Office (UICO) and maintained in the responsible department or administrative office's search verification files. Contact UICO to obtain a blank certification form.

HELPFUL HINTS PER EXCLUSION AGENCY'S ONLINE RECORD SYSTEM:

Office of Inspector General's (OIG) List of Excluded Individuals/Entities (LEIE)

• Link to LEIE online search system: https://exclusions.oig.hhs.gov/.

Perform searches on the LEIE search system by copying/pasting the potential match individual's **last** and **first name** from the SC Search Results page to the LEIE's online individual name search screen to eliminate the risk of typographical errors. (e.g., James L. Brown, an individual, should be entered in the Last Name (Brown) and First Name (James) search fields.)

- Verify DOB by clicking on the Last Name link listed for the potential match. The Exclusion Search Results will display. The DOB is the fourth item from the top.
- Verify SSN by clicking on the Verify "SSN/EIN" link. Enter the SSN (without dashes) for the university employee or affiliated individual. The LEIE search system for SSN verification will include a notation of "N/A" if the OIG does not have record of SSN on file for respective individual or state "NO MATCH" if the SSN for the university employee or affiliated individual does not agree to the SSN of the potential match.
- The LEIE record may include a unique physician identification number (UPIN) sixplace alpha numeric identifier (assigned to physicians by Medicare through Sept 2006) or a National Provider Identifier (NPI) that is a recently assigned unique 10-digit identification number issued to health care providers in the U.S. by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services. The UPIN or NPI can be used to assist in verification procedures for physicians or all health care providers, respectively.

General Services Administration's (GSA) System for Award Management (SAM) Excluded Parties List System (EPLS)

- Perform exact name match searches on the SAM database by copying/pasting the potential match individual's full name from the SC search results to the online Search, Select Domain, Entity Information, Exclusions, and Excluded Individual screen to

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eliminate the risk of typographical errors. Once the search returns results, use the filter results to eliminate records.

- Verify SSN on SAM for potential match name search results by using by using the same process in the above bullet and entering the SSN/TIN. Enter the potential match name and employee SSN (without dashes). If there is a match, the details will be provided. If there is not a match, the screen will read "No match found."
