Dear Campus Research and Clinical Community,

Our university's Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) Taskforce has done great work to activate many of our research and clinical laboratories to start gathering available PPE to ensure that healthcare workers in our hospitals are fully equipped with the items they need in anticipation of the growing COVID-19 pandemic. We acknowledge and appreciate the previous donations from the research community that have contributed to this level of preparedness.

To date, UofL Health medical leaders report that their PPE inventory is adequate and they believe that they are equipped to handle both current cases and the anticipated surge of cases that may come. Additionally, a recently developed N95 respirator decontamination program will soon launch so that used masks can be sterilized and safely reused.

Please call ahead to 852-5231 to ensure that someone is available to receive the boxed items. For laboratories on Belknap Campus, please email a donation pick-up request to <u>cathy.price@louisville.edu</u> and include the building name and room number where boxed items are located. Lab personnel need not be present; just clearly mark the box as "PPE Donation."

By DEHS serving as the central drop-off and collection service for our available PPE donations, we will be able to report and track any items purchased with NSF grant funds as well as ensure that all donations are delivered to the nearest Kentucky State Police post or Transportation Cabinet location as requested by the Governor's Office.

UofL is an engine for knowledge, innovation and resources. Please help us answer our state's call for action and mobilize our university to donate available resources with our greater community and health care heroes across the state.
