When and where should my scholar arrive to campus?

This year we are giving all scholars the opportunity to check into their residence hall before EAP Check-In. All scholars are asked to report to their assigned hall where they will be assisted with room keys and all things related to their new space.

May my scholar commute back and forth to campus for this program if he/she is not living in the residence halls?

Yes. Any scholar not living in UofL residence halls or properties may drive back and forth to campus each day. Parking directions will be provided for students who are in need of receiving such.
