EARLY ARRIVAL PROGRAM FAQs

When and where should my student arrive to campus?

This year we are giving all students the opportunity to check into their residence hall before EAP Check-In. All students are asked to report to their assigned hall where they will be assisted with room keys and all things related to their new space.

May my student commute back and forth to campus for this program if he/she is not living in the residence halls?

Yes. Any student not living in UofL residence halls or properties may drive back and forth to campus each day. Students who do not have a parking pass will need to contact the Parking Office at 852-7275 for parking options.

Will my student need money for food?

All participants of EAP will have a number of meals, snacks and beverages provided free of charge throughout the duration of the program.
