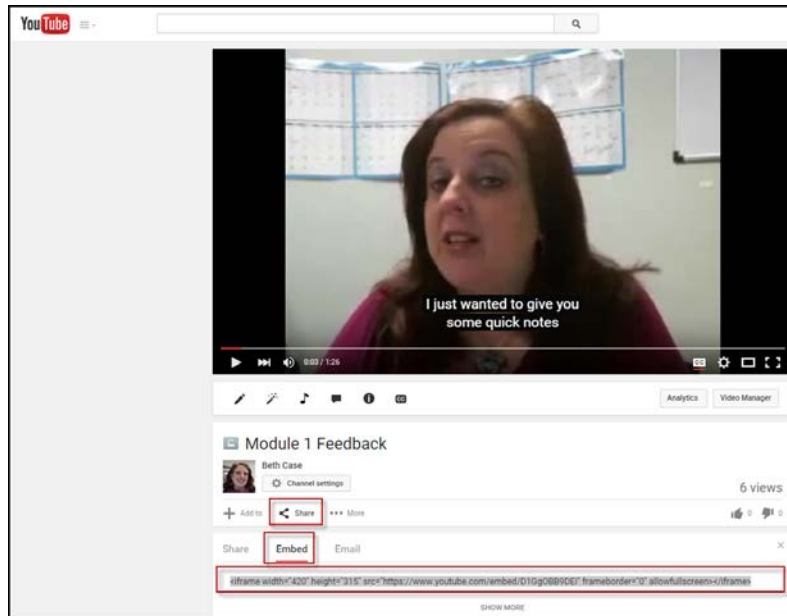


# Embedding YouTube into Blackboard

Adding the video to your Blackboard course is easy. It allows your students to watch the video without leaving the Blackboard environment and does not take up any storage space within Blackboard itself. The video must be saved as either Public or Unlisted.

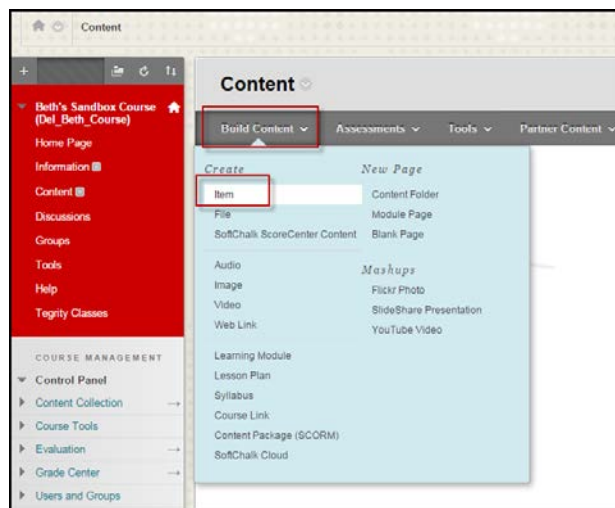

From the video's page on YouTube

- a. Click **Share**
- b. Choose **Embed**
- c. Copy the text that appears in the box.
