ABOUT THE DEGREE

Mission

Our mission is to prepare you with skill sets to become the next generation of educators, researchers, leaders, and academic decision makers. Our program encourages the pursuit of excellence in local, national, and international communities.

Degree Focus

Our degree is a Ph.D. in Educational Leadership and Organizational Development (ELOD), with a specialization in Sport Administration. At the University of Louisville, ELOD is the umbrella degree for a variety of programs. This association allows us to utilize the resources of their program while still providing a comprehensive Sport Administration curriculum.

Degree Requirements

Our students come from a variety of educational backgrounds. To ensure students have sufficient mastery of the core content areas, students may be required to take graduate level courses in Sport Administration as part of their specialty component or elective component.

Timetable

Typically, it takes a full-time doctoral student two (2) years to complete all coursework to become eligible to take Comprehensive Exams. A dissertation usually requires 1-2 years of additional research and writing. Students usually finish the program in three (3) years.

Funding Sources

Funding opportunities are highly competitive, as they are at other institutions. Funding opportunities may take the form of a GA (Graduate Assistant), and qualified students may also be eligible for selected University Fellowships or Diversity Fellowships.

A cohort is typically 2 - 3 new students each year. Students from around the world including the United States, Canada, South Korea, Japan, Taiwan, Malaysia, India, Germany, and Sweden have thrived in our program.

Faculty

Our faculty leverages extensive publication records with strong industry experience to generate research addressing sport industry trends, challenging you to grow, and helping you actualize your pursuit of a career. Everyone is on your team.

Quality

The doctoral program at the University of Louisville was the first to be accredited by the Commission on Sport Management Accreditation (COSMA). COSMA is a specialized accrediting body whose purpose is to promote and recognize excellence in sport management education worldwide in colleges and universities.

Research Opportunities

Our program is a research-oriented degree where students actively engage in research teams with faculty and other doctoral students. Writing for publication as well as submitting proposals for presentations at national and international conferences is encouraged and expected. A clear research focus helps match students with advisors and prepares them for a dissertation topic.

Teaching Opportunities

Opportunities are available to teach undergraduate and graduate SPAD classes. Ph.D. students have taught both core and elective courses and supervised internships.

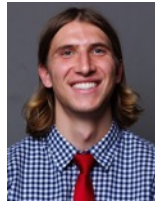

ADMISSIONS PROCESS

Students are evaluated for admission to the program using a holistic approach, which considers the following qualifications:

- Is the applicant likely to succeed in doctoral study? Is there evidence the applicant possesses professional expertise and promise?
- Does this doctoral program appear to be a viable match for the applicant's goals?

APPLICATION MATERIALS

- Graduate Application
- Résumé or Curriculum Vitae
- Letters of Recommendation: 2 required letters of recommendation (academic references preferred, but required for all applicants whose undergraduate work was completed within the last five years)
- English Language Exam: TOEFL, IELTS, or Duolingo English Test required* for applicants for whom English is not their primary language
- Transcripts: all official transcripts from any courses or degree programs taken at previous postsecondary institutions (other than dual credit)
- Personal Statement
- Analysis Essay

In addition, an applicant may also submit or participate in any of the following additional opportunities that are optional but not required for admission:

- Personal interview at the discretion of the committee
- GRE Scores
- Any academic or published works/ creative artifacts you have been a part of or produced

DEADLINES

Admission review dates are October 1st and February 1st. Applicants wishing to be considered for a University Fellowship must meet the October 1st deadline.
