Note: The number of year matriculating through the program include the year-long internship. We accept students at both the post-baccalaureate and post-master’s levels. Students with master’s degrees in Counseling Psychology or related fields may petition to have their coursework reviewed for possible waiver of certain course requirements. Waivers occur after reviewing syllabi and other course materials and determining consistency with departmental expectations and occurs following successful admission to the doctoral program. Theses and previous practicum training are similarly reviewed. Students with completed master's degrees in fields unrelated to counseling psychology may not be able to waive course requirements but again, will be reviewed.

Note: Amounts shown are for first year (12 months) in the program. We admit full-time students only and offer **stipend, tuition waiver, and health benefits** for a 20-hour per week graduate assistantship (GA). The yearly stipend amount is \$19,000. Fellowships may be available also with the same benefits, but without GA work responsibilities. Though there are no future guarantees, all students over the past 15 years have received yearly renewable 3-4 year GAs or 4-year Fellowship/GAs combination.
