Dr. Guskey will be working with the Educational Administration Leadership (EAL) program on curriculum development, supporting the EAL students, presenting on his expertise of grading/feedback, and exploring programming for international educational leaders. He is author/editor of 24 award-winning books, more than 250 book chapters, articles and professional papers. Dr. Guskey has received several prestigious awards, most recently the Albert Nelson Marquis Lifetime Achievement Award, and was named a Fellow in the American Educational Research Association (AERA).
