Sun a Distinguished Lecturer at UT Austin

Jeffrey Sun, Professor in the Department of Educational Leadership, Evaluation and Organizational Development, was the 2016 Distinguished Lecturer for the Program in Higher Education Leadership at the University of Texas at Austin in April. He discussed findings from his study on judicial expectations of college administrators. Dr. Sun and co-investigator, Dr. T. K. Daniel, the William Ray and Marie Adamson Flesher Professor Emeritus at The Ohio State University, analyzed over 5,000 state and federal court opinions to construct a schema analysis on how courts interpreted and set expectations about the roles and responsibilities of college administrators.

Hums Co-hosts Kazakhstan Olympic Hopefuls

Mary Hums, Professor in the Sports Administration Program in the Department of Health and Sport Sciences, along with the Muhammad Ali Center, hosted a group of junior Olympic hopeful boxers from Kazakhstan. The visitors were participants in the Sports Diplomacy Program through the U.S. Department of State. This initiative is an International Sports Program designed to work at the grass roots level to aid youth, ages 7 - 17, in discovering how success in athletics can be translated into the development of life skills and achievement in the classroom. The initiative provides the student participant an opportunity to establish linkages with U.S. sports professionals and exposure to American life and culture. The experience also provides Americans the opportunity to learn about foreign cultures and the challenges young people face. Dr. Hums spoke with the group about building leadership and mentorship skills through sport.


SPAD Students Plan Annual Golf Scramble
