Cumberland and Immekus to Partner with OVEC on Hi-Q2 Project

Denise Cumberland, Assistant Professor, and Jason Immekus, Associate Professor, both in the Department of Educational Leadership, Evaluation and Organizational Development (ELEOD), received a grant to conduct an evaluation of the perceived quality and effectiveness of the Ohio Valley Educational Cooperative (OVEC) professional development of the Hi-Q2 Math project. Students' mathematics achievement (e.g., interim assessments,

end-of-grade test scores) data will be used to determine the extent to which the training may influence teachers' classroom practices related to promoting academic achievement. Qualitative data will include interview data from OVEC professional development participants, which will be based on semi-structured interview questions gathered from focus groups conducted three times over one year.
