## Language

Statutory creation

KRS chapter 387

KRS 387.510 Definitions

### **Definitions**

**Guardian** means any individual, agency, or corporation appointed by the court to have full care, custody, and control of a disabled person and to manage his financial resources.

**Limited guardian** means a guardian who possesses fewer than all of the legal powers and duties of a full guardian, and whose powers and duties have been specifically enumerated by court order.

### **Definitions**

**Disabled** means a legal, not a medical disability, and is measured by functional inabilities. It refers to any person 14 or older who is:

- Unable to make informed decisions with respect to his personal affairs like physical health and safety, health care, food, shelter, clothing, or personal hygiene; or
- Unable to make informed decisions about his financial resources

Such inability must be present within 6 months prior to the filing of the petition for guardianship or conservatorship and shall not be evidenced solely by isolated instances of negligence, improvidence, or other behavior.

### **Definitions**

**Respondent** means an individual alleged to be a partially disabled or disabled person.

Ward means a person for whom a limited guardian, guardian, limited conservator, or conservator has been appointed.

### When is a Guardian needed?

- Disabled individual
  - Fully disabled
  - Partially disabled
- 2. Evidence of disability
- 3. Not voluntary situation

#### Interdisciplinary Team

physician, psychologist, and social worker

## **Guardian** ad Litem

Attorney, impartial; best interest standard;

## Hearin g/Trial

60 days; only decides disability;

## **Duties and Responsibilities**

KRS 387.660

Medical or other Custody professional treatment\*\* **Education** Rehabilitation **Vocation** 

- Least restriction
   of freedom
- "In loco parentis"

\*\*Except: abortion, sterilization, psychosurgery, removal or bodily organ or limb without prior court approval;

## **Duties and Responsibilities**

**Full vs. Limited** 

**Annual Reports** 

Annual status report Biennial financial report

## Alternatives to Guardianship

**Limited guardian** means a guardian who possesses fewer than all of the legal powers and duties of a full guardian, and whose powers and duties have been specifically enumerated by court order.

### **Power of Attorney**

Voluntary not court appointed

### **Social Security Payee**

### Alternatives to Guardianship

**Conservator** means an individual, agency, or corporation appointed by the court to manage the financial resources of a disabled person.

Limited conservator means an individual, agency, or corporation appointed by the court to assist in managing the financial resources of a partially disabled person and whose powers and duties have been specifically enumerated by court order.
