Sponsored Programs Financial Compliance 2017 Changes

Beginning January 1, 2017 the University will be strengthening oversight of federally sponsored funding. The goal of these changes is to monitor the "health" of federally sponsored programs to ensure that they are managed in alignment with federal regulations.

Some of these changes will include:

- Increased awareness and diligence from SPA, CCD, OIE personnel
- Modified processes & data collection at award stage
- Increased monitoring of personnel and non-salary costs

- Hosts an annual conference on personal finance and financial wellness for higher education administrators who work with college students
- Connects research to practice by using empirically-supported evidence to shape Center-developed initiatives

Grawemeyer Award in Education

Diana Hess & Paula McAvoy were awarded the 2017 University of Louisville Grawemeyer Award in Education for their 2014 book *The Political Classroom: Evidence and Ethics in Democratic Education* which explores the role of teachers in perpetuating serious, thoughtful political deliberation in schools.

The book is based on a four-year study of 35 teachers and their 1,000-plus students. Their analysis included 21 schools representing all points on the political spectrum. Hess and McAvoy provided compelling case studies that showcased the power of the deliberative process in helping students hone thinking, reasoning and communication skills as they examined the question: "How should we live together?"

CEHD will host the winners for a free lecture during the spring semester. Be on the lookout for dates and times to meet and listen to Dr. Hess and Dr. McAvoy speak about their work.

CIBRS is the College of Education & Human Development's newest center as it was founded in fall 2016.

What does CIBRS do?

- Works to engage the application of scientific methods to understand and prevent student failure and dysfunction.
- Collaborates among a wide range of interested parties across the University to focus specifically on prevention efforts as they relate to education – broadly defined as public schooling from pre-school through post-secondary education
- Provides an impetus and structure for enhancing nationally recognizable research and scholarship in areas that represent pressing social concerns – with a focus on educational experiences from pedagogical, psychological, and social work perspectives.
