## Job Description:

As a book festival intern you will gain experience in day-to-day management of a festival and a non-profit organization. You will provide support to the festival staff and Board before, during, and after the festival. Based on the skills and interests of the intern, you will assist with a variety of duties related to backend festival planning and promotion. These may include general office management, event production, promotional publishing and social media, author and publisher outreach and correspondence, special events programming, and festival exhibits.

- An interest in developing a career path in publishing, non-profit sector, or special events
- Organizational skills to manage multiple tasks, attention to detail, and the ability to prioritize in a changing environment while adhering to deadlines.
- Strong interpersonal, verbal, and written communication skills

- Knowledge in social media and document design .
- Ability to work independently and as part of a team.

This internship is a non-paid, part-time position. Expect to contribute 5-10 hours per week, not to exceed 80 hours total, including the entire two-day period of the festival.
