# BACKGROUND

University of Louisville (UofL) Libraries are comprised of:

1) Ekstrom Library serving humanities, social sciences, life sciences, business, engineering, physical sciences, and technology,

- 2) Kornhauser Health Sciences Library,
- 3) Anderson Music Library,
- 4) Bridwell Art Library,
- 5) Brandeis School of Law Library
- 6) University Archives and Special Collections.

UofL's library system supports the teaching and research needs of more than 22,000 students and more than 7,000 faculty and staff. UofL belongs to the Association of Research Libraries (ARL), an organization of 126 North American library systems affiliated with large, comprehensive research institutions; the State-Assisted Academic Library Council of Kentucky (SAALCK); and the Kentuckiana Metroversity, a consortium of Louisville area libraries.

Ekstrom Library provides access to the resources most relevant to the proposed Six Sigma Black Belt Graduate Certificate. The proposed certificate is in the Speed School of Engineering -Industrial Engineering. The program consists of 9-credit hours of required courses primarily focusing on statistics, operations management, and the process improvement methodologies of six sigma. There are no new courses developed for the program. The program is fully online. This means that online library collections and services will be especially important for this program.

This report provides a summary of library resources that support teaching and research in subjects pertinent to the proposed Six Sigma Black Belt Graduate Certificate, as well as the libraries' support of distance learning programs.

## COLLECTIONS

## Books

According to WorldCat, UofL has hundreds of eBooks and print books related to operations management, statistics, process improvement, and related topics. The majority of the library's holdings in relevant subject areas to this certificate were published more than five years ago. Here is a breakdown of the library's holdings categorized by selected general subject search terms:

## **Other Resources**

There are <u>online research guides</u> in Engineering, Technology, and Business created by university librarians which can be used to support the Six Sigma Black Belt Graduate Certificate program. There is also a <u>data management research guide</u> and a research guide for <u>finding data and</u> <u>statistics</u>.

Graduate students may also benefit from the <u>Productive Researcher Portal</u>, which provides tools and strategies for comprehensive literature searches and other resources for advanced

researchers. Ekstrom Library also provides regular training in <u>EndNote</u> citation management software.

#### SERVICES

### **Research Assistance and Instruction**

Each library within the University of Louisville Libraries offers instruction programs designed to meet the needs of its researchers. Ekstrom Library's information literacy program provides both face-to-face and online research instruction tailored to specific courses and assignments. The library's <u>Research DIY</u> website offers additional online support for students, with brief video tutorials, infographics, and other instructional materials. Ekstrom Library has a librarian assigned to the Speed School of Engineering to provide specialized assistance with research, collections, and information literacy instruction. Ekstrom Library provides research assistance through inperson consultations, e-mail, telephone, and online chat.

#### **Interlibrary Loan and Document Delivery**

Books and periodicals not held by the UofL Libraries are identified through online databases and WorldCat, an online union catalog with more than 32 million records describing materials owned by libraries around the world. Faculty, staff, and students can request materials through UofL's <u>Interlibrary Loan</u> (ILL) service. Articles and chapters are sent to patrons via email; books obtained through ILL are available for patrons to pick up at Ekstrom Library or are mailed to distance students living in the United States. Full book service is not available to international locations.

Document delivery services allow patrons to request library-owned articles or book chapters less than 50 pages in length, within copyright fair use guidelines, to be scanned and delivered to them electronically. Ekstrom Library has a <u>Distance Learning Services Specialist</u> who provides online learners with access to print and electronic resources.

#### CONCLUSION

UofL Libraries already supports the courses in the proposed Six Sigma Black Belt Graduate Certificate. The University of Louisville Speed School does not anticipate a need for any new library books, journals, databases, or other services to support the new program. No new courses will be developed for the Six Sigma Black Belt Graduate Certificate. Current library collection can meet the needs of faculty and graduate students in the proposed program.
