Introduction

The Graduate Certificate in Public Health Training is offered by the School of Public Health and Information Sciences. It requires completion of 12 hours of credit and all courses are offered only as distance education (asynchronous online courses).

The Certificate in Public Health Training provides individuals with skills required for a career in a public health setting. The curriculum integrates courses in the 4 core areas of public health with practical applications for public health practice and preparedness.

Competencies

The successful student is able to:

• Exhibit knowledge and skills identified in the CEPH foundational public health learning objectives and MPH foundational competencies. (CEPH 2016 Accreditation Criteria – see sections D1 and D2)

It is expected that prior to graduation, students in the program have demonstrated these competencies by completing the curriculum.

Admission

Applicants must have completed a baccalaureate degree from an accredited institution with a minimum of 2.75 GPA on a 4.0 scale.

Application requirements are submitted to the Graduate School, Graduate Admissions and include:

- Formal application
- Curriculum vitae
- Application fee
- A minimum of two letters of recommendation related to the applicant's academic or professional history
- Official transcripts indicating conferral of a bachelor's degree
