Dear PPPRC Committee:

This letter is to signify my strong support for a new Undergraduate Certificate in Diversity, Inclusion, Community Engagement, and Equity (DICEE) in the Workplace. The program design was led by Dr. Randy Whetstone, Clinical Assistant Professor with a focus on diversity in the workplace, and approved by the Department of Educational Leadership, Evaluation and Organizational Development (LEAD) and the CEHD Curriculum Committee. This program was viewed across the University through the pre-LOI process and was approved due to its unique focus on diversity within the workplace.

As noted in the LOI, the purpose of the DICEE in the Workplace certificate program is to prepare leaders working in a multitude of fields (e.g., military, corporate, non-profit, healthcare, government, private sector, etc.) to implement best practices and strategies around diverse hiring, inclusive workplace environments, effectively engaging with marginalized communities through meaningful organizational partnerships, and equitable treatment among all employees in the workplace. The audience for this certificate are individuals working in leadership roles, especially those with some college but have not earned a college degree, who seek specialization in DICEE.
