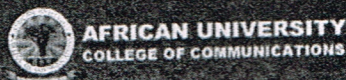

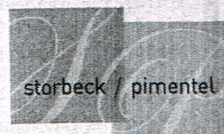

The Board of Trustees of Widener University announces the search for its tenth president. The Search Committee invites nominations of and applications from accomplished individuals who will provide the university with exceptional leadership. The next president has a unique opportunity to build on Widener's significant progress over the past decade and to fulfill its promise as a preeminent metropolitan university.

Grounded in mission, building on strength, and poised for new initiatives, Widener University seeks a new president with vision, energy, and a commitment to academic quality. Leadership at Widener will require a substantive track record of achievement, an ability to listen and plan with input across all university stakeholders, and the courage to make progressive decisions. Strong academic credentials are highly desirable; understanding of the academy is essential. In addition, personal characteristics of integrity and authenticity are critical, as are an uncompromised work ethic and a genuine sense of humor.

Widener University, over its 195 year history, has grown into a four-campus university offering more than 150 programs of study at the undergraduate, graduate, and professional levels. The university's campuses in Chester, Exton, and Harrisburg, Pa. and Wilmington, Del. serve approximately 6,000 students. Students on the Chester campus pursue degrees in six schools and colleges that offer liberal arts and sciences and professional and pre-professional curricula leading to associate's, baccalaureate, master's, and doctoral degrees: College of Arts and Sciences; School of Business Administration; School of Education, Hospitality, and Continuing Studies; School of Engineering; School of Human Service Professions; and the School of Nursing. Widener has the unusual distinction of boasting two law schools that will operate independently effective July 1, 2015: Widener University Delaware Law School in Wilmington houses Delaware's only law school; and Widener University Commonwealth Law School in Harrisburg. Widener's Exton Campus houses an academic cooperative that offers opportunities for intellectual development, cultural stimulation, and social interaction for retired adults through its Osher Lifelong Learning Institute.

Widener has continued to evolve with a comprehensive strategic plan that emphasizes student transformation through civic engagement and leadership development. There has been a flowering of creative initiatives that has enhanced the quality of Widener's academic and co-curricular offerings, including a pioneering program in Human Sexuality and the recently established Oskin Leadership Institute.

Widener embraces its identity as a metropolitan university in an urban setting. The Chester campus is only twenty minutes from Philadelphia, the nation's sixth largest city and home to world-class art, culture, sports, entertainment, and history. Regional public transport enables students to commute easily from campus to an internship or co-op or to spend the day exploring enriching venues of Philadelphia, such as the Philadelphia Museum of Art, Philadelphia Zoo, National Constitution Center, Liberty Bell, and Independence Hall. The campus itself sits on 110 acres and has benefitted from \$220 million in new construction and renovations over the past decade.

Widener has recently successfully completed a comprehensive campaign, Taking the Lead, which raised over \$64 million to support critical programs, bolster financial aid and augment the endowment. Widener attracts students from 34 states and 26 foreign countries. Thirty-five percent of its undergraduates study abroad and seventy-five percent participate in internship, community service, and/or volunteer programs. Enrollments on the Chester campus, for the most part, have remained stable. Undergraduate admissions have been particularly successful during 2014-15.

The variety of Widener's academic programs, the talent of its teaching faculty, the balance of liberal arts and professional offerings, and its wide array of student markets and pedagogies provide a cutting-edge foundation for this leadership opportunity.
