

Fall 2026 Recruitment Update as of 9/29/2025

- Applications: 3,958 (+400, +11%)
 - Louisville area: 1,465 (+172, +13%)
 - Outside Louisville in Kentucky: 893 (+105, +13%)
 - Out-of-State: 1,168 (+178, +18%)
- Admits: 2,563 (+460, +22%)
- Transfer: 108 (even with last year)
- Readmit: 20 (even with last year)





U.S. News & World Report's Best Colleges in 2026

- UofL increased 21 spots for 2026; 37 spots since 2025 with unchanged methodology from 2025
 - Increased 13 spots as a public institution (97 to 84) from 2025 to 2026; 22 spots from 2024 to 2026.
- 17 indicators of academic excellence and are assigned a weight determined by U.S. News
 - Outcomes include:
 - Graduation rate
 - First year (fall to fall) retention rates
 - Social mobility as measured by how well institutions graduate economically disadvantaged students
 - Borrower debt
 - Earnings as defined college graduates > high school graduates

U.S. News & World Report's Best Colleges in 2026 (Cont.)

- Peer Assessment
 - Determined by surveys completed by Deans, Provosts, and Presidents.
- Faculty Resources
 - Faculty salary
 - Student-faculty ratio
 - Proportion of faculty full-time
- Financial Resources determined by the average spending per student on:
 - Instruction
 - Research
 - Student services
 - Other related educational expenditures
- Student Excellence i.e. standardized test scores
- Faculty Research based on bibliometric data such as publications and citations.
