# REPORT: Ad hoc Committee on Presidential Compensation - Steffen

Senator Steffen reported on the work of the Senate's ad hoc Presidential Compensation Committee. The committee was formed last spring by Chair Feldhoff. Members were appointed in May and met over the summer and early fall. Other members are: Enid Trucios-Haynes, Ray Austin, Roger Bradshaw and Krista Wallace-Boaz. Chair Feldhoff had charged the committee with 3 tasks: examine UofL's presidential compensation; compare UofL with CPE benchmarks, ACC and regional schools; and, examine the process of determining presidential compensation at UofL. Initially, a list of 25 schools was developed. It included CPE benchmarks and some ACC and regional schools. Research began on the internet and various web sites. It was determined that the information was not uniformly measured and not always from a reliable source. Finally, the information from the *Chronicle of Higher Education's* article Executive Compensation was used, as it was both reliable and used uniform measurements for each school. Senator Steffen presented a Power Point in October. Today he presented the narrative report.

### **DISCUSSION: REDBOOK and Sabbatical Leave - Feldhoff**

Sabbatical policies from our benchmarks will be discussed at the Executive Committee meeting. Recommendations from that discussion will be forwarded to The REDBOOK Committee. The REDBOOK Committee has its work scheduled for the year and Chair Feldhoff does not want to interrupt that flow. Senator Owen (A&S) said that A&S chairs thought the matter was urgent. Chair Feldhoff said her plan is to present it to the Provost in January 2016. The process starts with the Executive Committee; to The REDBOOK Committee for review and vote on changes; to the Faculty Senate; and, finally to the Provost. ## **DISCUSSION: GET HEALTHY NOW Assessment - Feldhoff**

The deadline to take the online health assessment to receive the \$40 monthly discount is November 19<sup>th</sup>, 2015. Some concerns were raised when it was announced that the assessment would now ask for blood pressure and cholesterol numbers. This information is a way to make participants' programs more efficient and is not a requirement to participate in the Get healthy Now program or to receive the \$40 monthly discount benefit. This health information is confidentially-held by a third party, and not available to Get Healthy Now employees. Find more information here.

### REPORT: UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT – Dr. James Ramsey

President Ramsey began his report with an apology for the recent controversy caused by the staff luncheon held the day before Halloween. He said he had made a mistake and has taken steps for his office to expand its diversity/sensitivity training. Turning to the NCAA investigation, Dr. Ramsey said he could not provide specific details, but to say that the investigation is ongoing. He asked the NCAA to provide more investigators and they sent one more, totaling 2 for the full investigation. The state is also conducting a criminal investigation. Each investigation is independent of the other and they are not sharing information. Professor Elaine Wise, the University's Faculty Athletic representative to the ACC, said that the Athletic Association has its own investigation committee and receives weekly updates from Chuck Smrt, UofL's consultant for the investigation. Moving to the CPE, Dr. Ramsey reported that at the last President's

Meeting, all signed a document in support of the CPE's funding model. A brief discussion took place on the performance-based funding model. Updating the Senate on academic recruiting trips, Dr. Ramsey said the outreach has expanded into major cities: Chicago, St. Louis, Indianapolis, Nashville and Atlanta. Tomorrow, there will be a special meeting of the Board of Trustees. Some members feel they should be involved with the NCAA investigation. He asked the NCAA and was told that he cannot share any investigation information with the Board. University Counsel, Leslie Strohm would be here to explain the legal issues, but she is in the court-ordered mediation with Norton's. Also, a suit has been filed against the governor, the Higher Education Nominating Committee and seventeen Board of Trustee members by a group, Kentucky Justice Research Center, for not following the state statute requiring that a designated percentage of members should reflect the student population. The suit seeks clarification of the phrase minority-racial composition. This raises several questions: Does Hispanic/Latino meet the requirement for a racial minority? If not, would more positions be available for African-Americans? Asked what remedial actions will be taken concerning the recent Halloween issue, President Ramsey said that former Provost Willihnganz had made very specific recommendations for diversity and sensitivity training. He has asked Dr. Pinto to expand on those and to bring other groups across campus into the training and discussions. Dr. Pinto added that he has already started working on campus climate, hiring more diverse faculty and other recommendations. President Ramsey said that actions will result from the discussions. In 2003, with Dr. Willihnganz's lead, each unit and VP area created diversity committees. Now, the CPE requires this. This is an opportunity to build on what we have done.

# REPORT: INTERIM UNIVERSITY PROVOST - Dr. Neville Pinto

Updating the Senate on dean searches:

- KENT in mid-November, airport interviews will be conducted for the Kent School position.
- CoB a list of candidates should be ready in mid-December.
- DENTISTRY a list of candidates by mid-January.
- All new deans should be in place by July 1, 2016.

### Reporting on new hires:

- A&S Lead Fiscal Officer Bridget Burke has been hired
- Director of Finance & Operations Kerry Schmidt has been hired and will report to Susan Howarth.

Provost Pinto then said over the next few Faculty Senate meetings he will report on the plans to implement the 21<sup>st</sup> Century Initiatives. - o GOAL 6 Improve Learning & Study Space

  Dr. Pinto said the classrooms will range in size from small to extra-large. The labs will mostly be science-based to address the high demand for STEM.
- INVEST IN EMERGING MULTI-DISCIPLINARY RESEARCH & CREATIVE AREAS
  - OGOAL 1 Identify Competitive Areas for Future Investment The RFP was released this week and proposals are due January 15, 2016. There is a cost share requirement from units, which may require reallocation and/or creative funding. Deans will have to make priorities and have difficult conversations in deciding on proposals to fund.

#### REVENUE ENHANCEMENT

Goal 1 – Strategically Grow Enrollment

The steering committee meets monthly and advises where to focus growth activity.

#### ADMINISTRATIVE ENHANCEMENTS

o GOAL 3 – Target Effective Resource Management

The Budget Allocation Model Steering Committee is looking at any and all possible funding models. This is a very complex undertaking and will take a lot of time.

The Administration is dedicated to updating/improving the survey and the Provost wants to ensure that it is done well. This year's budget is already set, so it will not happen this year. It may take multiple years to achieve equity.

# REPORT: Faculty Senate Chair - Feldhoff

Chair Feldhoff reported on several topics:

• Faculty Salary Work Group – she is a member of this group. The methodology of the last survey is being refreshed; term faculty information may be added separately; the goal is to complete the work by the end of December. The work group has met twice and was charged to 1.) Recommend how to make equity adjustments, 2.) Identify salary inversion/compression, 3.) Expand the performance evaluation to make sure it's equitable, and 4.) Make recommendations how to finance these issues.

- The chair said there are many issues to consider before recommendations are sent to the president and provost.
- UofL faculty member, Maureen McCall, PhD was chosen as an ACC Guest Lecturer to speak at Florida State University. She spoke Thursday and Friday before the Saturday game between UofL and Florida State. Information can be found here.
- Jill Suttles, the Vice Dean for Faculty Affairs at the School of Medicine is stepping down and an internal search for her replacement will be conducted.
- A search committee for the Director of Human Resources vacancy has been charged, but has not met.
