ACTION ITEM: MEETING MINUTES – WALLACE-BOAZ

The minutes of <u>December 4, 2019</u> meeting passed unanimously.

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ACTION ITEM: ACADEMIC PROGRAMS COMMITTEE - PROGRAM PROPOSALS - NG

- College of Business <u>Bachelor of Business Administration</u>
 - The proposal was presented by faculty members from the College of Business, Dr. Kristen Lucas, Dr. Lynn Boyd and Dr. Richard Germain. The College currently offers a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration, which does a deep dive into each of specialty areas. The proposal includes the same undergrad core courses, introductory courses for each of the disciplines and a capstone course. According to student feedback over the years, there is interest in a broader study of business. This degree will bring in students who could not meet the stringent requirements for the B.S. degree. After the discussion, the vote was taken and the proposal passed.
- Speed School MS in Materials and Energy Science & Engineering
 - This is a thirty-hour multidisciplinary master's program with science courses in A&S and engineering in Speed. UK has a broad PhD program, but this one is very narrow. The proposal passed unanimously.

REPORT: FACULTY SENATE CHAIR – WALLACE-BOAZ

Chair Wallace-Boaz reported on the following:

- Mr. Kevin Gardner, the new Executive Vice President for Research and Innovation will begin on January 27th.
- Faculty representation is requested on two committees.
 - First Generation Students Support Team
 - Search committee for the Director of Business and Auxiliary Services. Bob Knaster has retired.
- The Board of Trustees will meet on January 23rd.
- David Owen has been appointed the Interim A&S Dean and has stepped down from the Faculty Senate. An election will be held in February to elect an interim vice chair until the annual elections in May.

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REPORT: UNIVERSITY PROVOST - BOEHM

Dr. Boehm reported on the following:

- Cardinal Covers over the winter break, dorms were open to international and LGBTQ students. About five companies made donations that provided meals for twenty students. It was a very positive experience for those students.
- Speed Code of Conduct There is more interest in units developing their own Code of Conduct for faculty. Some units have professional standards, but not all have a code of conduct. Dr. Boehm asked senators to send her their unit's code of conduct.
- Budget Model Work Group This used to be the Tuition Revenue Committee. It is now working on developing guidelines for collaboration between units. She will bring these to the Senate for advice.
- REDBOOK Review Committee The report is still in the President's office.
- Student Well-Being Committee This committee met before the winter break and will meet again next week. Subcommittees are meeting and discussion ways to help students be successful and mentally healthy. There are a lot of roadblocks to student success here and we want to address those.
- Advising Task Force This committee is up and running.
- IBM Partnership This is also up and running.
- Consensual Sexual Relationship Policy This is under review.
- Faculty Accountability Committee Tracy Eells and Sandy Russell are leading this effort.
- A&S Dean Search David Owen has been appointed the Interim Dean in A&S.
- EVPRI Kevin Gardner has accepted the position and will begin on January 27.
- Open Resources Dean Mardis is leading a committee to investigate how our students may be able to benefit from open resources. This may help them save money on textbooks.

REPORT: UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT - BENDAPUDI

President Bendapudi reported on the following:

- EVPRI Rob Keynton did a great job as the Interim EVPRI. Many thanks to the search committee. Kevin Gardner will be great.
- HSC Hospital Acquisition We will be conservative in all negotiations. All signage will change in February.
- CPE Presidents from all state institutions met with CPE President Aaron Thompson. He shared some of his observations about affordability and student mental health. He met with student groups from all over the state and said that the UofL students were the biggest and most open he met with.
- IBM Good things are coming together. We are working on an agreement for IBM courses to be available to faculty and staff for free. The past few weeks they have been working on quantum computing, which is very cutting edge and something no other university has.
- Philanthropy Within one week of the hospital acquisition, the University had \$100M, \$50M of that was philanthropy.
- Questions
 - Ouestion: How does it look for the state loan?

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- Reply: We are trying to gauge. We are very sure of the House votes, but we need more in the Senate.
- Introduction President Bendapudi introduced Colonel Jessie Murdoch. Colonel Murdoch is retiring from the U.S. Army and will be interning in the president's office for two months. The president thanked her for her service to the country and to UofL.

INFORMATION ITEM: BELKNAP CONSTRUCTION - WATKINS/BECKER

The University's Chief Operations Officer, Mr. Mark Watkins gave an overview of upcoming construction projects on Belknap Campus and Mr. Gary Becker explained the impact those projects will have on parking. The results of a housing study revealed that on-campus housing needed to be updated and the state approved a \$90 million plan for two new facilities. Both Miller and Threlkeld Halls will be torn down and rebuilt. The new Miller Hall will be built starting this spring and completed by June 2021. Then, Threlkeld hall will be torn down and those students will go into the old Miller Hall. Then, the new Threlkeld Hall will be built. The current Cultural Center will be torn down and moved into the new Miller Hall. It will take about 18 months to complete both projects. Old Miller will be taken down after the new Threlkeld is completed in 2022. The old Miller Hall space may become a parking lot or held for a new academic building. Mr. Watkins said he is looking for parking options on that side of campus. He will have more information later this semester. Mr. Becker reported on the impact the construction projects will have on employees. The red lot, next to the University Club will be used for construction vehicles that will enter from the back of the Student Activities Center. Employees using that lot have been notified and temporary spaces have been located for them. The small lot next to Miller Hall will be converted to a reserved lot. Guests may still park in the North visitors lot, though those spaces will be reduced. More information will be coming out soon on this and on the Threlkeld situation. Another change to be made is in the 4th Street and Cardinal Boulevard visitors lot. About 20 spaces have been added for faculty and staff parking by reducing visitor spaces.

DISCUSSION ITEM: BENEFITS DESIGN WORK GROUP – SCHULTZ

Senators David Schultz and Patrick Harris serve on this committee. A brief discussion was held at the Faculty Senate's December meeting regarding proposed changes to some benefits. The proposed waiting period for healthcare coverage for new hires has been eliminated. Senator Harris said that the feedback given to the committee is seriously considered. It is hoped that the proposed surcharge for tobacco use is stricken and turned into an incentive to stop its use. The committee will meet again in February.
