### ACTION ITEM: Approval of the September Minutes - Mueller

### **REPORT: University Provost - Bradley**

Provost Bradley updated senators on the searches that are underway.

- **College of Business** The dean search committee has been selected and WittKieffer is the consultant firm.
- School of Dentistry Letters to Dentistry faculty will go out October 2<sup>nd</sup> in preparation for elections to the search committee. It is anticipated that the committee will be charged in mid-November.
- **Executive Vice President for Finance & Administration/CFO** The committee has been formed, and WittKieffer is the search consultant firm. With an aggressive timeline, semifinalists' interviews

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will take place in November and finalists invited to campus in early December. This search should be finished by the end of the year.

#### INTRODUCTION: Dean of the School of Nursing - Nash

Dr. Whitney Nash was introduced as the new Dean of the School of Nursing as of July 1, 2024. She was at UofL for seventeen years before leaving to become the Dean of Health Sciences at Georgia Southern University. The School of Nursing has been busy the last couple months with increased enrollment and grants. Dean Nash is very optimistic for the school's future.

#### FEEDBACK: Centers & Institutes – Bradley/Goldstein

Mr. Bob Goldstein, Vice Provost for Assessment & University Decision Support explained that the university has not been consistently applying its own policy on centers and institutes, which may have an impact on SACS accreditation. In 2020, questions about this issue were brought up, but with the various transitions since then, it was never fully addressed. The inconsistent approval process, resulted in a proliferation of centers and institutes. This proposed policy creates a process that includes oversight and review. #### **INFORMATION ITEM: University Libraries – Fox**

University Libraries Dean, Dr. Bob Fox reported on cuts in journal subscriptions due to the library's budget under the new budget model. Expenses that were previously covered centrally, are now assigned to the library. With the increase in these expenses over the past three years, cuts have been necessary and now include journal collections as they come up for renewal.

#### **REPORT: Student Government – Waddle**

SGA Representative, Ms. Macy Waddle reported that SGA has donated \$500 to the Testing Center to cover student costs. Toward finals week, SGA will donate to the Testing Center again to cover tests at that time. Feedback from students has been very positive. Ms. Waddle has also been working with the Open Educational Resources (OER) Committee on making textbooks more affordable. Student feedback on the cost of textbooks has been gathered by the committee, and it will hold a workshop for faculty to discuss this issue.

#### **REPORT: Staff Senate - Patterson**

The Staff Senate met on September 10<sup>th</sup> and ULPD Chief Green said that there are free steering wheel locks available for KIA and Hyundai owners. Contact him directly.
