## SPECIAL ELECTION: Ballot Planning & Budget Committee - Acklin

Chair Mueller informed the Senate of General Counsel Angela Curry's determination that despite a contrary provision in the Faculty Senate Bylaws, the lack of a Redbook requirement for Board of Trustees approval means that amendments to the bylaws become effective upon adoption by the

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Faculty Senate. An electronic ballot for this election is therefore prescribed by recent amendment of the bylaws.

Senator Acklin presented the special ballot and sought floor nominations. None were made and nominations were closed. The online ballot will remain open for 48 hours.

# ACTION ITEM: Approval of the October Minutes - Mueller

## **REPORT: University Provost - Bradley**

Provost Bradley reported on the following topics. This report is online and linked above.

- Enrollment and Retention The fall 2024 enrollment numbers are at an all-time high as are the first time in college and freshmen class. The retention from year one to year two increased 4% over last year to 81.5%. The six-year graduation rate was predicted to fall below 60% because of the impact of Covid-19 pandemic, but the actual number was 61.1%. The highest rate is 62.2%, in 2022. Sights are set on reaching 70% over the next few years.
- Faculty Compensation Review Committee Dr. Bradley reported that he has put together a committee to address compression issues, lack of including years and service and inconsistencies in merit raise procedures across units. This committee is charged with making recommendations on how to move forward on these issues, including the resumption of merit-based salary increases. The committee charge and membership are in the presentation.
- Library's Journal Subscriptions The rapid rise journal subscription costs is a huge
  problem across higher education. Libraries Dean Dr. Bob Fox and his staff have been
  working on trying to unbundle journals from a single publisher to be able to subscribe to
  particular journals with high utilization. The publishers are not inclined to unbundle their
  offerings.

#### INFORMATION ITEM: Course Modalities Standards | Summary - DePuy

Senior Vice Provost Dr. Gail DePuy explained the increase of teaching modalities from two (inperson and online asynchronous) to four (in-person, online asynchronous, online synchronous, and blended). This expansion gives faculty greater choice in modalities for delivering their courses, and students will be better informed before registering. Additional modalities are not a requirement to change the modality of individual classes. Blended courses will not have an online fee. This information is online and linked above.

### **REPORT: Student Government - Waddle**

Ms. Waddle reported that the SGA provided funding to the library to extend hours during finals and to the Mail Room for postage for mail-in ballots. Ms. Waddle was appointed as the student representative to the Council on Post-Secondary Education. the SGA provided funding to the Mail Room for postage for mail-in ballots. SGA is putting together care packages for Metro College students and covering the \$15 Testing Center fee during finals.

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#### **REPORT: Staff Senate - Patterson**

Ms. Patterson reported that the Staff Senate met last month and heard reports from President Schatzel, the Ombuds Dr. Diane Tobin, Mr. Nick Peak on governmental matters, and Ms. Danna Williams on cyber security. This report is online and linked above.

#### **REPORT: Faculty Senate Chair - Mueller**

Chair Mueller reported on the following topics.

**Library Journal Subscriptions** – Dr. Mueller reported that he continues to advocate for one-time funding to preserve current journal subscriptions this fiscal year. He serves on the University Budget Steering Committee and will work on a solution for the Library to maintain journal subscriptions appropriate for an R1 institution.

Rave Alert – The alert that came out on Halloween should have been labeled a 'timely warning' and not an 'alert', as there was no immediate danger to anyone on campus. He spoke with ULPD Chief Steve Green about the mislabeling of the message.

**Faculty Compensation** – As a matter of fairness, Dr. Mueller is advocating for a second phase of the Faculty Compensation Study parallel to that in response to the Staff Compensation Study and the resumption of merit-based salary increases.

#### REPORT: University Ombudsman - Tobin

Dr. Diane Tobin, the University Ombuds, provided an annual report highlighting trends including communication issues, budgetary concerns, hierarchical issues, and the need for supervisor training. She emphasized the importance of positive recognition in the workplace.

### ACTION ITEM: Proposal for a Graduate Certificate in Analytics for Decision Making - Ng

After a description of the certificate program, it was noted that the College of Business has a similar certificate. The proposal was tabled until further investigation into the possible overlap. The proposal is online and linked above.

#### **ACTION ITEM: Proposed Closure of Dentistry Certificates - Ng**

Due to the replace of these certificates with master degree offerings, these closures are only administrative and will have no impact on faculty, students, or staff. The certificate closures were approved and are linked above.

# INFORMATION ITEM: Course Equity Grade Dashboard - Barrow/Boswell/Sweeney-Martin/Young

The team presented the Course Grade Equity Dashboard, which provides easy access to data concerning equity gaps in student outcomes in particular courses. The dashboard is offered as a first step to improve equitable course outcomes towards increase the graduation rate. The team gave a demonstration of the dashboard and various data sets.
