ACTION ITEM: Approval of the March minutes - Mueller

The March meeting minutes are attached above and were approved as distributed.

REPORT: University Provost - Bradley

Dr. Bradley reported the hiring of Dr. Karlis Kaugars as the Vice Provost for Information Technology Services and Chief Information Officer, Dr. Kathryn (Katie) Cardarelli as the Dean of the School of Public Health and Information Sciences, and Dr. Whitney Nash as the Dean of the School of Nursing. Dr. Bradley also reported on the positive impact on UofL of the Kentucky biennial budget and presented a timeline for the faculty compensation study. The report is linked above.

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UPDATE: Course Catalog Policy Revisions—Class Attendance - DePuy/Willey

At last month's meeting, the Faculty Senate endorsed proposed changes to the Course Catalog Policies except for Class Attendance. Dr. Gail DePuy presented altered language based on the discussion at last month's meeting (highlighted in green in the attached document). The Senate voted to endorse the changes.

<u>REPORT: Student Government – Depp</u>

REPORT: Staff Senate – Patterson

Ms. Patterson reported that the Staff Senate met on March 13th and received updates from the UofL Foundation's Keith Sherman, Dakota Walker from the Center for Military-Connected Students, and Dean of Students Michael Mardis and Dr. David Parrot from Student Affairs. REPORT: Faculty Senate Chair - Mueller

Chair Mueller stated that the new hires announced by the provost will be invited to future Faculty Senate meetings to introduce themselves. At the May meeting, senators will be presented with the report of the AI Committee. Dr. Mueller has followed up with the administration on several topics raised by the Executive Committee, including grade inflation, the benefits portion of the total rewards study, and the resumption of merit-based faculty raises.

INFORMATION ITEM: Community Engagement Strategic Plan - Craddock

Dr. Douglas Craddock from the Office of Community Engagement reported on the progress of UofL's 2023-2025 Community Engagement Strategic Plan goals. He explained what the goals are and the paths to achieve them. This report is online and linked above.

UPDATE: Blackboard Ultra - Thompson

Dr. Kelvin Thompson reported on the Blackboard updates from Original Course View to Ultra Course View. This planned update started with a small pilot group last summer and will continue over five semesters. The feedback he received from faculty and students was overwhelmingly positive with some very notable exceptions. As the updates moved out of the pilot stage, heavy Blackboard users encountered issues with some of their most-used features. Often, these are still available in Ultra but need to be implemented differently. Training on the Ultra version is available.

ACTION ITEM: B.S. in Communication Sciences and Disorders - Ng

Dr. Chin Ng, Chair of the Academic Programs Committee introduced the proposed B.S. Degree in Communication Sciences and Disorders. The proposal was approved by both the Academic Programs and Planning & Budget committees of the Faculty Senate. The program proposer, Dr. Alan Smith, explained the program and its purpose. After a clarification on reciprocity between A&S and other units requiring Cardinal Core courses in new programs, the program was unanimously approved. <u>ACTION ITEM: Second Reading – Revised Library Unit documents Clean Version | Redlined Version - Winters</u>
The revised Libraries unit documents were approved without discussion. The documents are linked above.

ACTION ITEM: Faculty Senate Bylaws changes – Elections - Clean Version | Redlined Version - Gosser/Winters

No changes had been made to the proposal (linked above) discussed at the April Senate meeting, and no one offered additional points of discussion. The changes were approved by a vote 42 in favor, 1 opposed, and 2 abstentions, which cleared the threshold (35) of a majority of the total voting membership of the Faculty Senate (69). The bylaws changes took effect immediately upon passage.

NEW BUSINESS

- Ms. Alexandria Underwood presented the <u>SGA Resolution 13.16</u> regarding the potential closing of the Rauch Planetarium.
- Senator Gerry Williger distributed a <u>handout</u> and made the following motion in support of the Rauch Planetarium. The motion was seconded and unanimously endorsed by the Senate.
 - 1) Endorse the Executive Committee statement of Oct. 25, 2023: "The Planetarium is an asset to UofL and the community and should remain open."
 - 2) Set up a Supervisory Committee composed of faculty and administration, and including at least one astronomer, to consult with astronomical and planetarium experts inside and outside the University to determine
 - (a) how the University can successfully run the Gheens Science Hall and Rauch Planetarium long-term, or
 - (b) why the University is different from those that do and therefore cannot support a planetarium.
 - 3) Request the delay of any irrevocable decision about the Planetarium or commencement of any repurposing, until this Committee releases its findings to the full Faculty Senate and University administration to make an informed decision.
