Action Item: Approval of October Minutes - Winters

The October meeting minutes were approved and are linked above.

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Moment of Silence for UPS disaster

Senator James Harrison suggested a moment of silence for those impacted by the recent UPS tragedy, which was observed.

Report: University President - Cardarelli

Interim Provost Cardarelli presented the president's report as Dr. Bradley was traveling. She presented updates to the university's viewpoint neutrality policy, detailing recent amendments made in compliance with HB4 and KRS 164, and addressed questions from faculty regarding policy implications, with input from University Counsel and constituent groups.

Report: Interim University Provost - Cardarelli

Dr. Cardarelli provided a comprehensive update on the university's artificial intelligence initiatives, including committee work, integration into the strategic plan, and plans for research, instruction, and administrative applications.

Al Committee and Task Force Reports: The Provost described the work of the Al committee chaired by Karlis Kaugars and a short-term advisory task force led by Jon Klein, both of which recently submitted reports with recommendations for Al use across campus. Al is embedded in multiple pillars of the university's strategic plan, and financial resources will be allocated to support Al-related initiatives in the next fiscal year and beyond.

Strategic Plan Review and Feedback Process: Dr. Cardarelli invited faculty to review and provide feedback on the latest draft of the university's strategic plan, which now includes detailed action items, and outlined the process for final approval and alignment with unit-level plans.

Enrollment, Retention, and Graduation Metrics: The Provost presented current data on enrollment, retention, and graduation rates, compared the university's performance to peer and aspirant institutions, and discussed strategies for improvement, including targeted recruiting and addressing unmet financial need.

Following up on then-provost Dr. Bradley's initiatives for student success, Dr. Cardarelli and Dr. Gail DePuy presented initiatives that included required syllabus information (linked above) and use of the Blackboard gradebook.

Report: Student Government - Price

Ms. Price reported that the SGA is establishing commissions to gather broader student feedback, reviewing several proposed student fees, and preparing an official statement on the \$25 media fee.

Chair Winters updated the senators on the continued efforts of implementing KRS164, data on open enrollment, a special election in December to fill vacant committee seats, the schedule of upcoming provost finalists' campus visits, updates on asset preservation, recognition of two ad hoc committees and an invitation to this week's football game.

Action Item: Second Readings - Ramirez

REDBOOK Modification

Senator Ramirez summarized the change to require performance and productivity reviews for faculty every four years, instead of five, to comply with HB4; the amendment applies to all faculty and will take effect after Board of Trustees approval. School of Public Health and Information Sciences Bylaws Changes

The main change is the removal of the Executive Committee due to overlap with the Faculty Council, streamlining governance. These documents were approved and are linked above.

A&S Revised Bylaws

The amendments grant A&S authority to modify standing committees without full Senate and Board approval, clarify voting rights for joint appointments, and distinguish between panel search and standing committees, aiming to improve efficiency. These revisions are linked above and were approved.

Action Item: Global Supply Chain Management BSBA degree program - Harris

Senator Pat Harris introduced Dr. Jeffrey Koleba and Dr. Cynthia Forgie from the College of Business who presented a proposal for a new Bachelor of Science in Global Supply Chain Management. They highlighted industry demand, job growth, and partnerships with major employers.

Information Item: Combatting Antisemitism Policy DRAFT - Winters/Atwell

Mr. Zachary Atwell from General Counsel was invited to discuss the draft Combatting Anti-Semitism Policy. He explained statutory requirements for the IHRA definition, and collected faculty feedback regarding concerns over language and implications for academic freedom and campus climate.

Senator Polzer introduced the findings of the A&S Total Rewards Ad Hoc Committee, outlining four proposed family-related benefits and requesting Senate support for a cost analysis to advance these recommendations.
