CARDS Excel Program Guidelines & Process

Students:

- Complete two engaged learning experiences preferably from two different categories with a minimum of 15 hours of involvement in a semester
- Submit one reflection per experience

CEL Team:

- Review experiences and reflections using a rubric and provide feedback to student
- Award graduation distinction to student

Benefits of participating in CARDS Excel

High Impact Practice: Retention is higher for students who participate in engaged learning

Students gain:

- Better understanding and application of course material
- Insight into their skills, interests, passions, and values
- Opportunities to collaborate with diverse organizations and people
- Broader view of the world; appreciation of community and diversity
- Professional practices and translatable skills
- Civic engagement
- Self-confidence and leadership skills
