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Strategic Planning to Date

- A third draft of the strategic plan was distributed to campus this October, with townhalls hosted on the Belknap (10/20) and HSC (10/21) campuses for feedback.
- A fourth draft will go to the Board of Trustees in late November for final revisions and approval in December/January.
- The University strategic plan along with the unit plans will be housed in Envisio, an online strategic planning platform that allows for linkage between plans and public dashboards to monitor progress.

Minimum Elements in Course Syllabus

- Reinforces the university's commitment to a coherent academic experience for all students to receive clear, consistent information about course policies, grading, learning outcomes, and support resources.
- Help students **navigate multiple courses**, especially first-generation or transfer students unfamiliar with varying expectations.
- Embeds **student success resources** (e.g., tutoring, advising, counseling, technology help) directly in every course.
- Additional information can be added to syllabus
- Review DRAFT syllabus elements (Link available in Faculty Senate Agenda)

Require Instructor Usage of Bb Gradebook

- Enables timely academic interventions from advisors or success coaches when students fall behind.
- Ensures students have real-time access to their academic progress, allowing them to monitor performance and seek help early.
- Reduces student anxiety and confusion by providing **consistent**, **centralized feedback** on course performance.
