REPORT: UNIVERSITY PROVOST- GONZALEZ

Provost Gonzalez reported on several topics.

Enrollment - Currently, we are down 194 students. Our budget was built on the assumption we would be over by 200 more students. We are now reviewing what level of students have registered - out-of-state, professional, graduate. Until we get those hard numbers, the budget is still somewhat fluid.

Covid Vaccinations - We have hired eight graduate students to get the data so we can report vaccination rates. This data will include vaccination rates by college or by program, as well as the overall rates. The most recent number for student vaccinations is about 67%. Higher numbers on the faculty, but I don't have the official numbers of faculty, and I hope we have them by tomorrow. Public health will help with analysis of the data so we could report students in College of Arts and Sciences versus Education and give those reports to the colleges. We hope that we could get some sort of competition going between the students, too. To try to get the vaccination rate up, there will be 28 pop up vaccination locations around campus. We are hiring a retired military lieutenant colonel to be in charge of the entire COVID response on our campus. He will start next week.

Dr. Gardner updated the Senate on several topics.

- Awards A review of awards for fiscal year 2021 showed new records were achieved over the records set in fiscal year 2020.
- Personnel Dr. Leigh Botner has been hired as the Director of Research Development and Support. She is a Kentucky native and comes to UofL from the University of Delaware. She is developing an orientation for new research and innovation
- Procurement Policy A new procurement policy was approved yesterday to make it easier to purchase equipment on a research account. Because of severe financial challenges in the past, restrictions were



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put in place that were stricter than the state and federal requirements. This made it very difficult to make purchases on research accounts.
