 Floyd Street. All will be open to students this fall semester.

REPORT: Interim University Provost's Office - DePuy

Dr. Gail DePuy, the Interim Senior Vice Provost, updated the Senate on happenings in the Provost's Office.

Student Retention – The President has already reported that this is the largest freshman class in the university's history, and the Provost's Office is spearheading efforts to retain them. We are working with the deans to build on each other's retention efforts, not duplicate them. The faculty will play a huge role in these efforts. More to come on that.

Searches – These are the searches taking place, so far.

Here is an update on the dean searches.

- A&S The search will be completed by the end of this calendar year. Libraries Dean Bob Fox is the chair
 of the search committee.
- Kent School This search will also be completed by the end of this calendar year. Music Dean Teresa Reed will chair the search committee.
- o Business and Nursing These searches are scheduled to take place in spring 2023.
- Education This search is tentatively set for fall 2023.

Other searches include a vice provost of online strategy and teaching innovation. This is comparable to the position held by Gail Rhodes. It has been slightly modified to escalate enrollment and growth in online learning. Greenwood Asher is the firm leading that search. The job description has been posted and will conclude by the end of this calendar year. Also, we will soon be hiring a chief cyber security officer. There is a strong pool of applicants and the interviews are going to begin soon.

Vaccine Updates

- COVID Currently, Campus Health has the Pfizer and Moderna vaccines for primary series and the new Pfizer and Moderna bivalent Covid booster vaccines. All faculty, staff and students are eligible and can sign up online.
- Monkeypox We are not hearing about spikes, but the university is taking steps to stay ahead and be prepared. Campus Health has launched a page on their <u>website dedicated to Monkeypox</u>.

Demographic 25 Committee - As you may be aware, there was a committee formed at the very beginning of the year when Lori was Provost. We know that the number of traditional college age students (18 years old) is going to take a sharp decline in 2025. In preparation for that, this committee was formed. The committee was made-up of nine subcommittees, and each of those subcommittees had several people. There was about 70 or 80 people were working on this for six to eight months. Each subcommittee developed strategies to help mitigate these challenges, and the committee presented their action plans to both Lori and Jerry on August 19th. The proposals tackled a number of different topics, including online learning, academic program quality, institutional aid, recruitment and more. The president and provost are now reviewing those proposals and will determine what the university will prioritize in both the long term and the short term.

Ms. Shuter updated on the Workday implementation progress. Workday HR will replace Peoplesoft HR. Some of you may only go in there to get your benefits. All you need to get is your paycheck and if that's the case we'll have quick reference guides to help you. And you don't have to worry about much else. Those who hire or do any recruiting, all of that be different and we will have training for that. Recently, we completed user acceptance testing that included about 80 folks across the university getting hands on the product early. It's been programmed to meet our needs and we kept our fingers crossed. We got great feedback. We got about 150 plus comments that we've been able to integrate to make sure that help test text is good to make sure that. We have over 180 different training materials that will be released in early November.
