ACTION ITEM: Approval of the July Minutes - Mueller

REPORT: University Provost - Bradley

Dr. Bradley reported on the preliminary enrollment numbers for fall. It appears that this fall's enrollment was record-breaking. At 23,781, this breaks the 1990 record of 23,000. In addition, our fall freshmen total is an all-time record. Tracking fall to fall retention, we are up 1% from last fall to 81.5%. To give these numbers some perspective, in 2019, it was 76%, so all the work around retention, student success, academic interventions and new scholarships is kicking in. The current proposal would ban chalking in all its forms and institute a stringent process for yard signs. The SGA opposes the policy as many Student Registered Organizations (SRO) use yard signs to communicate with the student body.
