- BAC direction must align with President's model
- Billingsley requested BAC to attend forum with current model in mind and return with recommendations of how to mesh the principles together. Simply put, the idea of engagement should neatly fit into the five pillars of the university's strategic plan.
- Why does community engagement pervade all five pillars of the strategic plan?
- Community engagement should be institutionalized because not everyone is defining the concept the same. In particular, Belknap Campus is having some issues.
 Community engagement requires some level of faculty training / orientation
- Define the interpretation of community engagement; rubrics are available. Many are doing it but are unaware they are doing it. Suggested workshops to bring the product and theory together.
- Carnegie definition is different than the university's definition.
- How does this lead to funding priorities
- Identify an established foundation, where are the potentials in terms of success, and build upon those criterial. For example, UofL has an access mission. However, high GPA/ACT attainment unintentionally affect the access. Community engagement involves first year retention, help students succeed.
- How does community engagement affect down-stream revenue? Retention is a phenomenal way to increase revenue.
- Centralization is key
