- Full synopsis of the presentation, for conference consideration (750 characters maximum)
- Equipment needed: computer, digital projector, screen, speakers, or other requirements
- Presentation Format (choose one of the following):
 - o Podium (10-15 minutes + Q&A)
 - o Poster
 - o Research Panel (40 minutes + Q&A)
 - o Short Digital Film (6 minutes maximum)
 - o Musical Performance or recording (6 minutes maximum)
 - o Art Exhibition

If you are interested in helping incoming Honors students during Summer Freshman Orientation, apply to become an Honors Peer Advisor! Honors Peer Advisors work closely with the Honors Program advising staff and administrators, assist first-years with the course selection and registration process during orientation, and promote and discuss the University Honors Program to incoming Honors firstyears and their family members.

Those selected to become Honors Peer Advisors will need to be available for training and all Summer Orientation sessions. Training will take place in mid-May while Orientation sessions will run through mid-July. If you are planning on taking summer courses, pursuing research programs, or have any other local summer plans, please keep the Orientation schedule in mind when applying. Honors Peer Advisors typically work between 15-20 hours weekly. It is a paid position.

- Intend and be capable of finishing the 24 credit-hour program



The undergraduate Boren Scholarship and graduate Boren Fellowship offer **\$20,000 or more in fund**ing for up to one year of academic study in languages and subjects of national security interest. Undergraduates can apply as a sophomore, junior, or senior. Boren Scholars represent a variety of academic backgrounds—from Political Science, to Global Health, to Economics, to STEM disciplines—but all are interested in studying less commonly taught languages and building expertise in regions of U.S. national security interest.
