HONORS NEWS WELCOME TO FALL 2020!



Welcome back, Honors students! Whether you're taking hybrid, remote, or distance ed classes this semester, we hope that your semester is off to a great and safe start, and we are looking forward to having some great virtual advising conversations with you in the near future! This year, we are moving toward a caseload advising model in Honors, so we have assigned Honors advisors to all of our incoming Fall 2020 first-year students. This means that those who have assigned advisors will receive their Honors Virtual Advising Campaign links from their assigned Honors Advisors directly while those who are not currently assigned to an Honors advisor (second-year students and up) will be able to choose an Honors advisor from a list of options.

You **must** meet with your assigned advisor. You will receive scheduling information directly from your assigned advisor.


Do I have an assigned advisor?


If you're not sure if you have an assigned Honors advisor, you are able to look this information up on both CardSmart and ULink. On the new ULink, you can click on the three dots in the upper right-hand corner of your screen, and click on the "Advisors" link to see a list of all of your assigned advisors and their roles. On CardSmart, your assigned advisors are listed on your profile screen on the right-hand side under "Student Success Team."

On the day of your appointment:

Log into MS Teams and be prepared to video chat. Your advisor will contact you via MS Teams to begin your appointment. If you do not have MS Teams open or will be more than 10 minutes late, you will be required to reschedule for a later date/time.

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STUDENT ORGANIZATIONS THE BLACK AND BROWN HONORS SOCIETY


The Black and Brown Honors Society is a new RSO that seeks to create a community where high achieving, underrepresented students can feel welcome and included within the Honors Program.

Through our growing network of undergraduates and professionals, we aim to create mutually beneficial connections and foster unlikely relationships.

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

Stay Healthy!



Avoid close contact with people who are sick.

Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth.

Stay home as often as possible, especially if you feel sick.

Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash.

Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces using a regular household cleaning spray or wipe.

Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after going to the bathroom; before eating; and after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing.

Use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol if soap and water are not readily available.
