Have a scheduled appointment? Make sure that you're prepared before it starts!

Download the MS Teams app. A few minutes before your appointment, open the Teams app and log in. *There will not be a link for your meeting.* Your advisor will message you on MS Teams to make sure you're present and ready, then they will begin your video chat.

We ask that you please be prepared for a video meeting with an Honor Advisor so that we can better serve you by sharing screens and providing advising information to you as clearly as possible.

Didn't get an appointment? Need a little more help? Take advantage of our virtual drop-in!



Log-In Advising is available on a first-come, first-served basis via CardSmart and Microsoft Teams.

Log-In Advising will not have you sign up for a future appointment; it is a virtual "drop-in" option that will place you with the first available advisor once you sign up during the designated times, detailed below.

Log-In Advising Steps:

During the Log-In Advising Period from October 29 - 30 and November 2 - 6 (excluding November 3, Election Day), between the hours of 8:30-11:30AM and 1:00-4:00PM, you will sign into CardSmart and request a meeting, following the instructions here:



DEADLINES: OCT 14 AND 21

Attention, seniors and recent alumni interested in careers in international affairs and foreign policy! Both fellowships include:

Up to \$95,000 to support 2 years of graduate study 2 paid internships (one on Capitol Hill and one at an overseas U.S. Embassy or consulate)
Mentorship by individuals with careers in foreign affairs A 5-year service Foreign Service appointment.

Students from any major who seek to promote positive change are invited to apply. Applicants must:

Have a GPA of 3.2 or higher Be seeking entry to graduate school for Fall 2021 Have a record of academic excellence, leadership, and commitment to public service

Women, students of marginalized identities, and candidates with financial need are particularly encouraged to apply; applicants can (and should!) apply to both programs.

Undergraduates can apply as a sophomore, junior, or senior. Boren Scholars represent a variety of academic backgrounds—from Political Science, to Global Health, to Economics, to STEM disciplines—but all are interested in studying less commonly taught languages and building expertise in regions of U.S. national security interest.

USAID PAYNE INTERNATIONAL DEVELOP-MENT GRADUATE FELLOWSHIP

DEADLINE: NOVEMBER 1

The USAID Donald Payne International Development Graduate Fellowship is now accepting applications! The Payne Fellowship is a U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) Program, administered by Howard University, which seeks to attract and prepare outstanding individuals for careers as USAID Foreign Service Officers. Candidates can be graduating seniors or college graduates with strong academic records and a desire to promote positive change in the world. The Payne program encourages the application of members of historically underrepresented groups in the Foreign Service and those with financial need. Selected fellows will receive support for graduate school and gain employment with USAID in an exciting and rewarding career in the Foreign Service.



Application Deadline: November 1, 2020. Email NISO@Jouisville.edu to get started!

Program Benefits:

- An orientation to the Program and the Foreign Service at Howard University in Washington, D.C.
- Two summer internships, one on Capitol Hill and one overseas at a USAID Mission.
- Up to \$22,000 annually toward tuition, fees and living expenses for a two-year master's degree in fields related to the Foreign Service such as development, economics, public administration, business administration, global health, agriculture, or environmental science at a U.S.-based institution.
- Mentoring from a Foreign Service Officer throughout the duration of the fellowship.
- Employment in the USAID Foreign Service for those who successfully complete the program and meet Foreign Service
 entry requirements, in accordance with applicable law and USAID policy, with each Payne Fellow committing to a minimum
 of five years of service.

Eligibility requirements:

- U.S. citizenship
- Seeking admission to graduate school in fall 2021 for a two-year program in an area of relevance to the Foreign Service at a U.S.-based institution
- Cumulative grade point average of 3.2 or higher on a 4.0 scale at the time of application.

CRITICAL LANGUAGE SCHOLARSHIPS

The Critical Language Scholarship (CLS) is a summer scholarship designed to provide students with the opportunity to study critical languages in countries of national security interest to the U.S. State Department. The eight to ten week program includes intensive language instruction and structured cultural enrichment experiences designed to promote rapid language gains and cultural immersion.

PUBLIC POLICY AND NATIONAL AFFAIRS PROGRAM JUNIOR SUMMER INSTITUTE

DEADLINE: EARLY NOVEMBER

The PPIA Junior Summer Institute (JSI) Fellowship Program is a rigorous academic graduate-level preparation program for undergraduate juniors committed to public service careers. The program was started to address the lack of diversity across the spectrum of professional public service, including government, nonprofits, public policy institutions, and international organizations.

The purpose of the JSI Fellowship is to prepare students to obtain a Master's or joint degree, in public policy, public administration, international affairs, or a related field. This **fully-funded opportunity** equips fellows with the knowledge and skills they will need to succeed in graduate school and ultimately, in influential roles serving the public good. Once a student has success-



fully completed their JSI, they join an alumni network of more than 4,000 leaders. In addition to the opportunities that this network provides for mentoring and career development, our alumni network has the opportunity to receive financial support for their graduate school education if they attend one of the programs in our Graduate School Consortium.

The JSI curriculum includes economics, statistics, domestic/international policy issues, and leadership topics, all designed to sharpen the students' quantitative, analytic, and communication skills. Extracurricular activities are included, as well. These skills are vital for admission into the top graduate programs in public and international affairs. The successful completion of a summer institute is a requirement for PPIA Fellows to qualify for graduate school benefits.

BARRY GOLDWATER

SCHOLARSHIP & EXCELLENCE IN EDUCATION FOUNDATION

DEADLINE: JAN. 29, 2021

The Barry M. Goldwater Scholarship funds the undergraduate study of college students who intend to pursue careers as high-level researchers in science, mathematics, and engineering. This prestigious award opens many doors for its winners. SOPHOMORES and JUNIORS with an established record of research in their field and a high GPA should consider applying.

MARY CHURCHILL HUM-PHREY SCHOLARSHIP

DEADLINE: DECEMBER 1, 2020

Mary Churchill Humphrey endowed the University of Louisville Centenary Memorial Scholarship in the late 1940s. Graduating seniors, recent alumni, and graduate students are eligible; applicants must have at least one major in the College of Arts and Sciences.

Candidates may apply to study at any university in the U.K. The MCH may be used to complete a one-year graduate degree or be used in the first year of a longer graduate degree program. The scholarship will cover a portion of the winning scholar's tuition and expenses; the exact amount of this year's MCH monetary award has not been set.

Many U.K. graduate programs accept applications roughly November-January. Applicants should check the policies at their chosen institution, which may have earlier deadlines for applicants who wish to be considered for additional funding.


