HONORS STUDENT COUNCIL ELECTIONS


Honors Student Council is proud to announce it will be hosting elections **this week!** All active Honors students are encouraged to vote. The following positions are contested, and the candidates need your vote!

THE WHITE SQUIRREL BOOK READING





REACH GRADUATE STUDENT ASSISTANT POSITIONS

REACH is now accepting applications for 2014-2015 Graduate Student Assistants. The application form is due by *April 4, 2014*. Interviews are selective. All application materials are due at the time of the interview if not submitted with the application form. Interviews for current applicants will be held April 14 through May 9. Applicants selected for first offers for GSA positions will be notified by May 19, 2014.

Application Requirements

- Graduate students applying must be full-time students accepted into a degree-granting program for the full academic year, 2014-15 (fall and spring semesters).
- Applicants are required to have earned 3.0 cumulative GPA during their undergraduate career (or most recent full-time graduate semester).
- Applicants need to be available to begin GSA responsibilities August 11, 2014 and be able to continue these responsibilities through the last Friday in May, 2015.
