

Honors Etscorn Scholarship Applications

Applications for academic scholarships with a value up to \$5,000 for the 2015-2016 academic year are now available.

Out-of-state students are eligible to apply. The application and its criteria, along with instructions, may be accessed at the University Honors Program's Scholarships page: http://louisville.edu/honors/scholarships/university-honors-program-etscorn-scholarship. These scholarships are funded through generous donations by the Etscorn Foundation. Completed applications, including all letters of recommendation, are due **Friday**, **April 10, 2015** by 4:00 P.M.

REACH would like to extend this Special Invitation to Honors students to apply to be a REACH Tutor or SI/ LA Leader for Fall 2015! There will be openings in all Centers & Programs and in all disciplines. REACH would like to give Honors students first priority for a position and they would like for you to complete the application as soon as possible or by **April 15th**. You should have a GPA of 3.0 or greater at the end of this semester and will need two letters of recommendation in which one must be from a professor and the other can be from another professor, or advisor, or job supervisor.

Listed below are brief descriptions of the SI/LA Leader & Tutor Positions:

• Math Tutors work weekly shifts in the MRC/VMC and work with students in a variety of Math courses from Math 100's Level up through Math 206/ENGR102 on a drop-in basis. This position can be for 5-20 hours per week.

- CRC Tutors work with students in the CRC & I Tech Zone on a drop in basis. There are also study groups for CIS courses and CECS course. This position can be from 5-20 hours per week.
- Small Group Scheduled Tutors work with up to 5 students in a specific course/or courses once per week at the scheduled appointment time. This position can be from 5-20 hours per week.

• Supplemental Instruction (SI) Leaders and Learning Assistance (LA) Leaders work with specific courses and/or Professors by attending a class section to up-date their notes & review, offering weekly study sessions/ office hours as well as test reviews for students enrolled in the course. This position is 10 hours per week.

DEADLINE WILL NOT BE EXTENDED AND APPLICATIONS MUST BE TURNED IN BY 5PM AS INDICATED. PLEASE NOTE THAT THERE WILL BE NO EXCEPTIONS. PLEASE MAKE THIS VERY CLEAR TO PERSONS WRITING RECOMMENDATION LETTERS FOR YOU.

If you are also applying for the Dennis C. Golden Torchbearer Scholarship, the Florence M. Strickler Red Barn Alumni Association (RBAA) Scholarships or the Bridgette Pregliasco Scholarship for Adult Learners, you need to have two letters of recommendation for each of them also. The same persons who gave you references for one of the scholarships could also give you references for the others scholarships, but you need to HAVE TWO LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION ATTACHED TO EACH APPLICATION THAT YOU TURN IN.

Dennis C. Golden Torchbearer Scholarship

Could you use a \$500 Dennis C. Golden Torchbearer Scholarship through the Torchbearer Program for the 2015 Fall semester?

If so, pay attention to the following!

To be eligible for this scholarship, you must have a completed application with two letters of recommendation ATTACHED, and turned in by **5pm on Wednesday, April 22, 2015**. If you are also applying for the Essie Jenkins Torchbearer Scholarship, the Florence M. Strickler Red Barn Alumni Association (RBAA) Scholarship or the Bridgette Pregliasco Torchbearer Scholarship, you need to have two letters of reference for each of them also. The same two persons who gave you references for one of the scholarships could also give you references for the other scholarships, but you need to have two letters of recommendation with each application turned in – NO EXCEPTIONS.

Study Abroad Peer Ambassador Positions

The position is for a Study Abroad Peer Ambassador within the International Affairs Department at UofL. We are looking for 2 – 3 students for the fall 2015 semester to work in our office and gain experience in advising while offering a student perspective about the study abroad experience. Students must be a current sophomore or junior that has studied abroad for at least one semester. Ideally candidates have studied abroad multiple times [any combination of academic year, semester or summer programs are acceptable]. Requirements:

- Registered student at the University of Louisville
- Sophomore or Junior status at time of application
- Previous participant in a [minimum] semester long credit-bearing study abroad program
- Strong communication and public speaking skills
- Computer skills including: Word, Excel, Outlook and Social Media knowledge
- Minimum 3.0 GPA
- Enthusiasm for promoting study abroad
- Responsibilities:

• Hold one-on-one walk-in advising hours to prospective study abroad students including; guiding students through the application process, address questions about financial aid and scholarship opportunities, helping students find programs tailored to their major/schedule/interests, etc

- Be willing and able to positively discuss your study abroad experience
- Be available to assist in campus recruitment events such as posting flyers, staffing information tables at events and leading presentations in classrooms
- Maintain a tidy work space and organize promotional material as needed
- Assist with occasional clerical tasks (copying, answering phones, etc)

Expected Schedule:

The Peer Ambassador Team is comprised of 2 - 3 students and is supervised by a Study Abroad Advisor or Graduate Assistant. Students must be willing to work 10 per week during normal office hours (Monday – Friday, 8:30 am – 4:30 pm). This is a semester long commitment. Your position may be renewed for an

additional semester provided demonstration of exemplary work and attitude.

Compensation:

Students will receive a \$650 scholarship at the end of the semester.

Please submit a resume along with the name, phone number and email address of three references. Two of your references should hold on-campus positions.

The Office of Study Abroad will review all applications and contact those selected for an in-person interview no later than Wednesday April 8th. Interviews will take place at the Office of Study Abroad between April 9th and April 15th with a final decision made on Friday April 17th
