Cardinal Hoedown

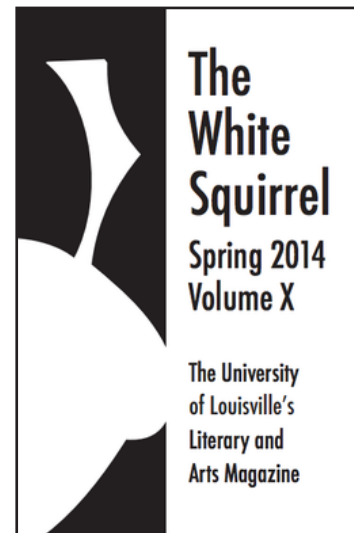
Thank you to everyone who came out to square dance at HSC's Cardinal Hoedown! People who had never square danced before even tried it, and they had a great time!

MASS Scholarships

Students with demonstrable financial need and involvement in the University Honors Program may apply for awards to buy books and supplies for spring semester classes. 


Posters At the Capitol

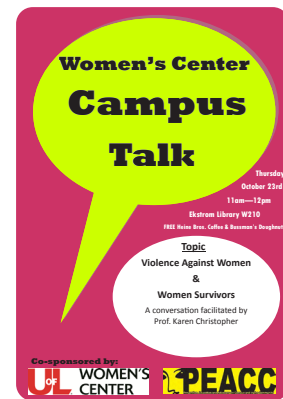
