You must participate in the KHR conference in order to present at SRHC, or have presented during a previous year. You may submit a proposal on the same topic for KHR and SRHC, but please note the slightly different criteria for SRHC proposals:

- Name and email(s) of Presenter(s)
- Title of Presentation
- Brief summary to be included in the program (30 words max)
- Full synopsis for conference submission (100 words max)
- Presentation format:
  - Podium Presentation (10-15 minutes)
  - Research Panel Presentation (min. two presenters)
  - Research Poster Presentation
  - Performance Pieces (max of 6 min. short film, music, performance, visual art display)
- Equipment needed based on presentation type.
- Powerpoint or Prezi, other computer applications, internet access needs, film capabilities, speakers, easel, laptop, projector, etc.

### THEN AND NOW: 2012 TRAVEL SEMINAR ALUMNI REUNITE

While current Honors students were traveling to New Zealand and the Philippines this past December, a small group of Honors alumni gathered to reminisce on their 2012 travel seminar to London. Honors Fellow, Dr. Michael Johmann, and Honors advisor, Ketti Tonnemacher, coordinated a trip at the time to expand on the seminar: Crime in Victorian Popular Culture. Sixteen students immersed themselves in Victorian London; going on Jack the Ripper and Charles Dickens walking tours, seeing *Woman in Black* on stage, visiting the Tower Bridge, and exploring the Sherlock Holmes museum (among other ventures.)

While three years had passed since the group's journey, listening to the alumni talk about their adventures made it sound as if the trip might as well have happened yesterday. Beyond the echoes of "I wish we were all there now," the group pulled memories out of one another and reveled in their old inside jokes. Admitting their jealousy of the current travelers, the alumni hoped the students would have an experience as impactful as their own. Travel seminars go beyond a trip together, creating bonds that are easily renewed no matter how much time has passed.




