Professor Trucios-Haynes joined the school's faculty in 1993. She is a nationally recognized scholar in immigration and focuses her teaching on constitutional law, immigration law, international law, and race and the law with an emphasis on issues affecting Latinos. She created the Brandeis School of Law Immigration Mini Clinic, is co-director of the Brandeis Human Rights Advocacy Project, was appointed as the Interim Director of the Muhammad Ali Institute for Peace and Justice, and serves on the Metro Louisville Ethics Commission by appointment, as President of the board of the ACLU of Kentucky, and as Secretary of the Hispanic-Latino Coalition of Louisville.

directs a public service placement that is affiliated with the National Immigrant Justice Center. For the latter effort, she leads volunteers conducting "Know Your Rights" presentations at the Immigration and Customs Enforcement Detention Center at the Boone County (Ky.) Jail.
