- Help promote BinC at UofL and in the Louisville area community.



What is the Book-in-Common Program?

Book-in-Common (BinC) is a community-wide learning experience for UofL's entire campus. Coordinated by the Office of First Year Initiatives, BinC intentionally supports new students in their transition and acculturation to UofL by engaging them in this unique academic experience. Students, faculty, and staff read and explore a common text incorporated into English composition and other courses across disciplines.

Then, to support and enhance classroom learning and discussion, BinC partners with campus and local community members to provide a year-long series of co-curricular activities revolving around the themes and issues raised throughout the text. Planned programs will begin in fall 2010 and include out-of-class group discussions, community service projects, an essay contest, film screenings, and a faculty lecture/panel.

Goals for Book-in-Common:

The Office of First Year Initiatives uses the acronym CAPS to describe the four areas of involvement that, when incorporated into a student's academic career, can lead to higher retention rates and better preparation for their college experience.

Civic: Students will engage with the university community (inside and outside the classroom) in events and activities related to the Book-in-Common.

Academic: Through interdisciplinary exploration and related activities, students will investigate key concepts and themes and complex issues raised in the text, thus furthering their critical thinking skills.

Personal: Students will learn more about themselves and the world around them as they explore diverse ways of thinking and being.

Social: Students will make connections with faculty, staff, and other students through participation in Book-in-Common.
