Essential Question Project Description EDTP 201

In EDTP 201, The Teaching Profession, you have learned new perspectives on teaching, schooling, and the contexts in which they operate. You have also learned much about yourself as a future professional.

For this final project you will synthesize your new insights from our semester's journey together by producing a digital project that answers our essential question: What does it take to be an effective teacher in the 21st century? Your project should be approximately 5-10 minutes in length and could take the form of a fictional storytelling narrative, non-fiction storytelling documentary, or a public service announcement. You can create a digital story or a marshup/remix in which you use multiple sources of video.

As you work on your video representation, make sure that you answer the essential question by considering the following areas:

- ➤ What is your role as an effective teacher?
- > What kind of classroom environment is most effective?
- ➤ What are the best teaching methods?
- ➤ How should effective teachers approach curriculum?
- ➤ How should teachers address diversity issues?

You will have access to the Digital media Suite located in Ekstrom Library. They have a staff there that are aware of the project and can help you will the technological aspect. Some of the resources that are available include 4 editing stations with iMovie, Final Cut Pro, a video studio with a green screen, camcorder checkout, and REACH tutors ready to provide assistance.
