## Research Interests

Initially my overarching area of study was close relationships including social support, relationship formation and maintenance, and family violence. While I continue to conduct some basic research in those areas with Michael Cunningham (Communication at the University of Louisville) and Kristin Mickelson (Psychology) at Arizona State University, and apply that knowledge in my current work with Becky Antle on Healthy Relationship Education and its effect on enhanced relationship quality and reductions in interpersonal violence, risky sexual behavior and transmission of STIs, my primary focus shifted in the mid- 1990s to child welfare system reform and organizational issues in youth serving organizations (including child care centers, the housing authority, faith based and community based organizations and the Neighborhood Places).

I have spent the last 26 years conducting both research and evaluation studies on the child welfare system itself. My emphasis has been on the impact of employee recruitment, selection, and hiring on retention and adherence to evidence based and best practices. I have studied how to train employees so that they will deliver the best services to families and children so as to lead to safety, permanency and well-being as well as the role of training reinforcement, technical assistance and clinical supervision on practice improvement and positive outcomes for children and youth. We have found that the content of the training is essential and must be embedded in sound theory and evidence. Thus, we have also studied the efficacy of a case management practice model on worker and client outcomes. All of this work has been funded by the DHHS, ACF, Children's Bureau but has finally led to Quality Improvement Center for Workforce Development (QIC-WD) where we are conducting efficacy trials of workforce interventions in 8 jurisdictions around the country. I am also working on an NIH proposal to examine what worker and supervisor variables affect adherence to EBP or evidence informed practices in working with families and youth aging out of the foster care system? This study will pull from my early work in relationships. Attachment researchers have found in the last few years that traumatic work environments like the military evoke attachment schemas. Supervisors with secure attachment styles are more likely to buffer anxious subordinates from the stresses of traumatic workplaces which led to better performance and coping. No workplace evokes attachment schemas more than the child welfare workplace. Thus, it is logical that attachment styles of supervisors and workers would affect decision making, practice, and adherence to certain types of practice models in child welfare settings. The interface of the role of attachment in the supervisor-worker relationship is compounded when the work centers on foster youth and the worker-youth relationship. This research will also tie my interest in child welfare system reform (including hiring and promoting members of the workforce, training and evaluating performance) to my interest in organizational impacts on families and youth.

In the fall of 2012, we received a grant from SAMHSA to establish the *Center for the Promotion of Resiliency and Recovery in Traumatized Children and Youth* to serve maltreated, military and refugee children. The Center was refunded in 2016 through 2021. I have also spent the past 18 years studying other youth serving organizations such as child care centers and faith based and community based organizations. At the turn of this decade we completed a DHHS, ACF Office of Community Services grant to build capacity in youth serving FBCBOs where we studied what works and what doesn't in bringing about organizational change in smaller rather than huge organizational systems. This work builds on two other federally funded grants working with systems and youth themselves who are at-risk for poor life outcomes as a result of dropping out of high school or aging out of the foster care system. In 2016 we completed a randomized controlled trial funded by the DHHS Office of Adolescent Health to test the effects of two interventions versus a control condition on prevention of risky behaviors such as dating violence and sexual interactions in vulnerable youth populations including foster youth, immigrant and refugee youth and urban youth. We found that a relationship based curriculum had better results in reducing all forms of risky sexual behavior in youth (e.g. initiating sex, having multiple partners, use of condoms and other forms of birth control) and pregnancy than a typical comprehensive sex education curriculum or a control curriculum. *Love Notes* is now on the evidence based list of teen pregnancy prevention interventions and we are now embedding *Love Notes* into residential centers serving youth involved in foster care and juvenile justice systems as well as schools and more community based organizations through a DHHS Family and Youth Services Bureau grant.

In addition our team spent a few years evaluating the efficacy of various policies and programs aimed at reducing and intervening in domestic violence situations. I was Principal Investigator on the grants funded through VAWA dollars and the state Cabinet for Families and Children and conducted it in collaboration with colleagues and doctoral students. Only a handful of states, one of which is Kentucky, have laws aimed at ensuring that medical and mental health providers become mandatory reporters of domestic violence. We were the first to evaluate the impact of that law in Kentucky on outcomes for victims of domestic violence. We found that victims like the mandatory reporting law and appreciated the interventions which helped them leave their abusive spouses and partners. We also evaluated a special program which allowed social workers to work with police in domestic violence runs. We found that the presence of the social worker helped in de-escalation of the situations and improved service delivery to victims of domestic violence and their children.
