- The program evaluation examined the effectiveness of the inaugural Part-time Faculty Teaching Academy. A pre- and post-test designed was used to examine the programming offered and the effectiveness of it in helping part-time faculty develop confidence, knowledge, and skills in teaching pedagogy. Focus group discussions were utilized to collect data for qualitative analysis.

Title: Contextual Effects on Student Academic Achievement: A Multilevel Analysis

- The purpose of this study was to investigate ways in which neighborhood, school and some individual characteristics independently and in tandem influence students' academic achievement and social behaviors. A cross-classified random effects multilevel model was used to examine individual differences in 4075 students' ACT/EPAS scores for all juniors in the Jefferson County Public Schools (JCPS) system in 2009-2010, who attended 21 different high schools in Jefferson County and lived in 35 different neighborhoods in Louisville, KY.

Title: ElderServe’s TeleCare Services: A Program Evaluation

- The program evaluation looked at program effectiveness of the TeleCare Reassuring Phone Services by examining the agency’s processes. TeleCare is a Monday-Friday telephone service where volunteers call elderly adults to make sure that they are well and are not in need of emergency assistance. The TeleCare program promotes independent living of elderly adults within their own homes. The goal of this program evaluation was to evaluate the strengths and weaknesses in the agency as well as to determine whether procedures are followed in an accurate and consistent manner. A posttest- only research design was used to measure the effectiveness of TeleCare. Data was collected by telephone using a survey developed specifically for TeleCare clients and their emergency contact/family member on file. Data was analyzed using Statistical Package for Social Science (SPSS).
