Dr. Sharon E. Moore, full professor of social work, at the Raymond A. Kent School of Social Work at the University of Louisville has authored journal articles and textbooks on issues related to police shootings of Black males, the plight of African American adolescents and the role of the African American church in community empowerment. Her published works include: *African American Mega-churches and Community Empowerment*, *Fostering Life in Dry Places*, *Hands up—Don't shoot: Police shooting of young Black males, Implications for social work and human services* and *The Black Church, Responding to the Drug-Related Mass Incarceration of Young Black Males: If you had been here my Brother would not have died!* She has also co-authored the texts *Dilemmas of Black Faculty at U.S. Predominantly White Institutions: Issues in the Post-Multicultural Era* by Mellen Press, *Social Work Practice with Culturally Diverse People* by Sage and *Police and the Unarmed Black Male Crisis: Advancing Effective Prevention Strategies* by Taylor & Francis. In 2006, she became only the second African American to become a full professor at the Raymond A. Kent School of Social Work since the program began in 1939. Of all her accomplishments, being the primary caregiver for her father during the last three years of his life was her biggest honor.
