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# Bachelor's Degree in Latin American and Latino Studies

### The Major in Latin American and Latino Studies offers:

- Interdisciplinary courses with an emphasis on Latin American societies from the perspective of their history, social, economic and political structures, literature, and culture, as well as courses that examine issues concerning Latinos in the United States, such as immigration, equality, social justice, multiculturalism, identity, and culture.
- Community Engagement through volunteer internships in Louisville or abroad.

#### Minimum Requirements for the LALS Major:

(All courses must have substantial Latin American or Latino content.)


- LALS 310 Introduction to Latin American Studies (CD1)
- LALS 311 Introduction to Latino Studies (CD1)
- 2 courses in the area of Humanities
- 3 courses in the area of Social Sciences
- 3 electives
- LALS 400 Internship (CUE/WR)
- 3 hours of Spanish or Portuguese at the 200-level, or demonstration of equivalent language proficiency

## Latin American and Latino Studies Minor

### **Minimum Requirements for the LALS Minor:**

(21 Hours. All courses must have substantial Latin American or Latino content.)

- LALS 310 Introduction to Latin American Studies
- LALS 311 Introduction to Latino Studies
- 1 course in the area of Humanities
- 2 courses in the area of Social Sciences
- 1 elective
- LALS 400 LALS Internship
- 3 hours of Spanish or Portuguese at the 200-level, or demonstration of equivalent language proficiency



# **Graduate Certificate in Latin American and Latino Studies**

This 15-hour certificate may be completed as a "stand alone" program or in conjunction with other graduate programs.

### Minimum Requirements for the LALS Graduate Certificate:

- 5 courses from at least three different disciplines, and may include LALS 681 Internship (3 must be at the 600 level)
- 3 hours of Spanish or Portuguese at the 200 level, or demonstration of equivalent language proficiency
